Preface

The issue of unmarked and unidentified graves in Kashmir has, for years, remained an emotionally charged and widely debated issue both at national and global level. While numerous reports, some grounded in advocacy, others shaped by political motives, have portrayed these sites as symbols of unresolved conflict and alleged human rights violations, much of the discourse has been characterized by polarized narratives. What has often been missing is a grounded, data-driven, and contextually nuanced investigation that considers both the humanitarian concerns and the operational complexities in a conflictaffected environment. The present report is the outcome of an extensive, field-based study conducted across four districts of the Kashmir Valley namely Baramulla, Kupwara, Bandipora, and Ganderbal. Drawing on a layered methodology that included physical survey and documentation of over 373 graveyards, the study provides a detailed account of how these graves came into existence. Testimonies were gathered with sensitivity, visual and geospatial data were documented, and wherever possible, official reports were crossreferenced to verify local claims. In doing so, the report presents a grounded view of how these graves came to exist not in isolation, but as a product of decades of militancy, crossborder infiltration, and counter-militancy operations in a highly volatile environment. Importantly, the report does not seek to cast blame, validate ideological positions, or offer simplistic conclusions. Instead, it aims to bring clarity to a deeply sensitive subject through a factual, context-aware lens. By centering on empirical evidence and local narratives, it seeks to challenge speculation and foster a more informed public and policy discourse; one that recognizes the interplay of militancy, foreign intervention, counterinsurgency efforts, and civilian vulnerability.

The findings point to a complex reality. A significant number of the graves contain unidentified individuals, many of whom were foreign militants who infiltrated across the Line of Control and were killed in security operations. In several cases, identities could not be verified due to the lack of documentation, and absence of claims by families. Graves of local militants constitute the second largest category documented in the study. Nonetheless, local communities and religious bodies made efforts to ensure that last rites were conducted in accordance with religious norms, even amid the pressures of active conflict. By centering the report around empirical data, community insights, and archival cross-verification, the report seeks to move the conversation beyond speculation and anecdote. It neither absolves nor indicts rather, it strives to contextualize the phenomenon of unmarked graves within the broader dynamics of militancy, counterinsurgency, and local vulnerability. As such, it offers a constructive contribution to ongoing discussions on conflict accountability, transitional justice, and the humanitarian dimensions of security operations. It invites local, national, and international readers and policymakers to approach the issue not through preconceptions, but through a critical understanding of the layered and often contradictory realities on the ground. In doing so, it reaffirms the importance of truth, institutional credibility, and measured reflection in one of South Asia's most enduring and complex conflict zones.

Chapter 1

Unmarked Graves in Kashmir: Historical Context

Introduction

The Kashmir Valley has long stood at the crossroads of political conflict, militant violence, and competing national and international narratives. Since the late 1980s, the region has witnessed significant violence, resulting in large-scale loss of life, displacement, and long-lasting trauma. Among the various humanitarian and legal controversies that have emerged from the long-standing conflict is the controversial issue of 'unmarked' and 'unidentified' graves across various districts of Kashmir valley. These graves have raised difficult yet crucial questions regarding identity, accountability, and the human cost of conflict. For understanding the issue of the claims regarding the existence of 'unmarked graves' in Kashmir, one needs to move beyond simplistic binaries and cover every aspect and dynamics of the conflict, documenting human rights violations and the impact of conflict from both state and non-state actors, while taking into consideration the nature of conflict. For this purpose, it is necessary that any study documenting the issue of unmarked or unidentified graves should neither uncritically accept the claim(s) by portraying all 'unidentified' graves as evidence of alleged human rights violations by state actors in terms of custodial killings or enforced disappearances of civilians by state security, nor should there be blanket dismissals of such concerns as propaganda. Any study in this direction should present an accurate and just account by addressing both aspects. To achieve this, a long-term field presence and an evidence-based approach are essential, one that recognizes both the operational challenges faced by Indian security forces amid ongoing militancy and the reality of genuine human rights concerns. Although the issue of unmarked graves in Kashmir has been studied before, our research approaches with it fresh eyes and systematic field methods guided by three motivations, humanitarian concern for the suffering of families, the need for reconciliation through truth and clarity and a solution oriented approach beyond ideological divisions, we aim to establish verified facts. By doing so, this report seeks to add to existing literature in a way that fosters informed dialogue, reduces uncertainty and supports possibilities for healing and peace.

The research report aims to bring a clarity on the subject of unmarked and unidentified graves for everyone, including people of J&K, international community, young scholars and researchers etc.

Evolution of Conflict in Kashmir

The roots of the Kashmir conflict can be traced back to the partition of British India in 1947, the subsequent accession of Jammu and Kashmir to India, and the wars and political contestation that followed. While the 1950s and 1960s witnessed phases of political shifts from the mainstream parties for greater administrative decentralization within Indian union, it was not until the 1980s that the region plunged into full-scale militancy. The roots of political unrest in Jammu and Kashmir during the 1950s and 1960s can be traced to the perceived erosion of the special constitutional provisions and the growing disconnect between the local population and the union government. Following the accession of Jammu and Kashmir to India in 1947, Article 370 of the Indian Constitution was added as a 'temporary' provision to guarantee substantial autonomy; however, over subsequent decades, this autonomy was progressively diluted for greater integration. A critical turning point occurred in 1953 with the dismissal and subsequent arrest of then Prime Minister Sheikh Abdullah, amid growing concerns within the Indian leadership that his political stance was diverging from the constitutional framework, prompting what was viewed by many as a necessary intervention to preserve national unity and constitutional integrity. After his dismissal, successive governments in Jammu and Kashmir maintained close administrative coordination with the Union government, though some opposition groups portrayed this relationship as limiting regional autonomy.

discontent stemming from perceived disparities between regional expectations and the broader objectives of national integration. Beyond this early unrest, political disillusionment escalated dramatically in the 1980s, particularly after allegations of widespread electoral malpractice during the 1987 state elections.⁴

Externalization of the Conflict: Pakistan's Role

The local, spontaneous militancy in the Kashmir Valley gradually evolved into an international issue, particularly as Pakistan assumed an increasingly active though indirect role by sponsoring militancy and affiliated networks. Following the Soviet Union's withdrawal from Afghanistan in 1989, Pakistan's military and intelligence agencies, notably the Inter-Services Intelligence (ISI), redirected their strategic focus and resources toward Kashmir.⁵ Pakistani agencies particularly the army establishment viewed Kashmir as the next front in a broader ideological and geostrategic contest against India. Consequently, Pakistan provided logistical support, funding, arms, and, crucially, facilitated the movement of both Kashmiri militants and Pakistan militants across the Line of Control.⁶ Groups such as Hizbul Mujahideen (HM), Lashkar-e-Taiba (LeT), and Jaishe-Mohammad (JeM) rose to prominence during this period, fundamentally altering the scale, intensity, and character of the conflict⁷.

Ghulam Mohammad's administration (1953–1963), marked by alignment with New Delhi, which some local groups viewed as a dilution of the state's special status under Article 370.

While the initial unrest in Kashmir was influenced by a range of concerns including aspirations for greater administrative decentralization and sensitivities related to regional distinctiveness, the subsequent involvement of Pakistan-backed elements introduced a more radicalized and externally influenced dimension, significantly altering the nature of the conflict.⁸ However, the growing prominence of radical groups, many advocating outright merger with Pakistan or a broader jihadist agenda, shifted the ideological center of gravity of the militancy.⁹ The arrival of foreign militants introduced extremist ideologies that further escalated militant activities and contributed to increased violence and instability in the region.¹⁰ Pakistan's strategic calculus treated the Kashmir militancy as a low-cost means of keeping India militarily and diplomatically off balance, even as the regional and international implications of jihadist militancy grew more dangerous.¹¹ Ultimately, the conflict's transformation from a largely local political movement to a transnational radical militancy entrenched divisions on the ground and deepened the geopolitical rivalry between South Asia's two nuclear powers, a dynamic that continues to shape the Kashmir conflict today.

Shift to Cross-Border Militancy

From the early 1990s onwards with the involvement of Pakistan, the Kashmir conflict took a critical turn marked by the increasing presence of cross-border militancy. Foreign militants, primarily from Pakistan and Pakistan Occupied Kashmir (POK), infiltrated into the Kashmir Valley in huge numbers, supported logistically and materially by Pakistan-based networks. ¹² This shift fundamentally altered the character of the Kashmir conflict.

While the initial phase of militancy was largely driven by local grievances and aspirations, many of which could potentially have been addressed within the Indian constitutional framework, as reflected in former Prime Minister Narasimha Rao's assurance that 'the sky is the limit', the situation changed dramatically with the entry of foreign elements. The conflict transitioned from a locally rooted political movement into a transnational militancy, led by foreign militant groups whose ideological goals extended far beyond Kashmiri concerns. These groups introduced radical agendas, escalated violence, and undermined the prospects for a political resolution that might have been possible in the early 1990s. 13 In response, the strategy of India's counter militancy forces also shifted from containing a local aspiration through democratic process to dismantling well-armed and highly mobile terrorist networks operating across Kashmir valley. The activities of foreign militants forced Indian government to increase its security presence, deploying large numbers of troops throughout the Valley and enacting stringent legislative measures such as the Armed Forces (Special Powers) Act (AFSPA), ¹⁴ which conferred necessary powers on security personnel in 'disturbed areas' to maintain law and order. While aimed to strengthen India's counter militancy capacity, these measures also coincided with a sharp rise in human rights violations. Various reports have highlighted the widespread cases of extrajudicial killings, arbitrary arrests, enforced disappearances, torture, and even custodial deaths. 15 Particularly troubling was/is the phenomenon of fake encounters, in

which security forces were accused of staging counter militancy operations to justify the killing of suspected 'militants.' These alleged abuses, often carried out under the legal protection afforded by the Armed Forces (Special Powers) Act (AFSPA), generated significant local and international attention.¹⁶

Largely, the phenomenon of unmarked and unidentified graves in Jammu and Kashmir became particularly prominent and was, in fact, a direct consequence of the peak conflict period from the early 1990s to around 2000, coinciding with the escalation of cross-border militancy following Pakistan's intensified involvement. During this time, the Indian security forces often engaged in frequent counter militancy operations against both foreign militants and local militants. Many of the casualties, especially those among foreign militants, lacked official identification documents, either due to operational secrecy, destruction of personal effects during armed engagements, or deliberate concealment of identities to protect networks as Pakistan government has always denied the involvement of its citizens in Kashmir's militancy. As a result, verifying the identity of the deceased particularly 'foreign militants' became logistically complex, leading authorities to conduct burials in unidentified graves without formal identification procedures. Moreover, in the chaos of ongoing military operations and poor documentation protocols, even some local civilians who went missing amid the violence may have ended up among the unidentified graves. ¹⁷ In this context, the phenomenon of 'unidentified killings' was only one dimension of the broader humanitarian crisis that unfolded in Kashmir during the 1990s and early 2000s. As militants' violence intensified and cross-border militant infiltration

raised to an unmanageable scale, Kashmiris increasingly found themselves trapped between state security operations and militant activities. In an environment characterized by heightened threats to public safety and national security, the Indian state undertook extensive counter militancy measures aimed at restoring law and order. In response, militant groups resorted to brutal tactics such as forced disappearances, targeted assassinations of political activists, intimidation and coercion of minority communities (notably Kashmiri Pandits and moderate Muslims), and the systematic suppression of dissenting voices. Militants frequently executed civilians suspected of collaborating with state forces, contributing to a culture of retributive terror that eroded traditional societal norms. In many cases, villages became battlegrounds, caught between the crossfire of militants and security forces, with civilians paying the ultimate price.

Counter Militancy, Human Rights, and Legal Challenges

Faced with a rising Pakistan-supported militancy during the early 1990s, the Indian state was forced to expand its counter militancy strategy in Jammu and Kashmir in an effort to restore public order and protect territorial integrity. The infiltration of heavily armed and ideologically driven militants, many with backing from Pakistan-based networks, created a complex internal security crisis that overpowered local law enforcement agencies. In response to sustained cross-border infiltration and the growing involvement of foreigntrained militants, the Indian government was compelled to enhance its security posture in the region. This led to the increase in the deployment of various security forces to safeguard national integrity, maintain public order, and support civilian administration under increasingly challenging circumstances. This rising militancy was complemented by the extension of the Armed Forces (Special Powers) Act (AFSPA) to Jammu and Kashmir in 1990, conferring more operational powers to security personnel, including powers to arrest without warrant and conduct searches. Supporters of AFSPA and the militarized response argued that such extraordinary measures were essential to counter the asymmetric threat posed by militants employing guerrilla tactics, and systematic infiltration across the Line of Control (LoC). However, critics, most notably Human Rights Watch and Amnesty International highlighted serious concerns over the potential for abuses, limited accountability mechanisms, and the erosion of civilian trust in state institutions.¹⁸

While intensified counter militancy operations succeeded to some extent in checking the rising militant networks and restoring partial civil governance, they were accompanied by allegations of human rights violations. High-profile incidents such as the *Pathribal fake encounter* in 2000, where five civilians were killed and misrepresented as militants responsible for the Chattisinghpora massacre, revealed serious operational failures; subsequent investigations by the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) described the killings as 'cold-blooded murder.' The Machil Fake Encounter in 2010 further exposed such systemic vulnerabilities, involving the luring and killing of three civilians near the LoC under false pretenses. Unlike previous cases, however, the Machil incident led to rare judicial action: five army personnel were court-martialed and sentenced, setting an important precedent for military accountability. More recently, in the *Amshipora fake encounter* of 2020, where three civilians were killed in Shopian district, prompt army investigations led to the dismissal and court-martialing of the officer responsible. Origin of Unmarked Graves

Building upon the phases of counter militancy and security operations discussed earlier, the emergence of the unmarked graves issue in Jammu and Kashmir represents a complex humanitarian concern arising from the exigencies of prolonged conflict. As discussed above, the issue of unmarked or unidentified graves in Jammu and Kashmir did not emerge in isolation. It was a direct consequence of the intense conflict that unfolded in the region from the early 1990s, involving frequent armed encounters, infiltration from across the Line of Control (LoC), and large-scale counter militancy operations. In the heat of active conflict, where many militants carried no identification, unidentified burials became a practical necessity rather than a deliberate policy of concealment. Such graves were especially found in frontier districts of valley.

It was the intervention of advocacy groups particularly the Association of Parents of Disappeared Persons (APDP) that brought the issue into broader public view. APDP was the first organization to document cases of enforced disappearances²² and, as it claims, has collected testimonies from families alleging that their relatives went missing during the peak years of counter-militancy operations in the Valley. Based on APDP's reporting, many of these families came to believe that their loved ones 'might' have been buried anonymously in remote graveyards across Kashmir. Building on this early documentation, the International People's Tribunal on Human Rights and Justice in Kashmir (IPTK), working alongside the APDP, released a report in 2009 titled Buried Evidence.²³ The report identified approximately 2,700 unmarked graves in select districts of North Kashmir and suggested a 'possible link' between these graves and the phenomenon of enforced disappearances. It called for a thorough forensic investigation to establish the identities of those buried in these unmarked or unidentified graves. Despite the important spotlight these groups placed on humanitarian issues, these early investigations particularly Buried Evidence had notable limitations. Their findings often reflected a

singular interpretive framework, which although on the surface looks was shaped by humanitarian concerns but was deep inside influenced by ideological predispositions, which highlighted more state-perpetrated abuses while giving less attention to disappearances caused by militant groups or the presence of foreign militants. In the absence of forensic verification such as DNA testing, these reports treated different categories of the deceased as the same, without clearly distinguishing between local civilians, local militants, and foreign militants. As a result, while the reports succeeded in raising accountability and political questions, their findings were challenged due to insufficient evidentiary documentation. Following the efforts of these advocacy groups, the Jammu and Kashmir State Human Rights Commission (SHRC) launched its own official investigation between 2008 and 2011. In their inquiry, the SHRC confirmed the existence of 2,730 unmarked graves across three districts. Importantly, the SHRC concluded that many of these graves likely belonged to unidentified militants, including foreign militants, killed during legitimate security operations. Nonetheless, it recognized that without scientific verification through DNA testing, it was impossible to rule out that some graves could contain disappeared locals. The SHRC therefore recommended a comprehensive forensic identification program, including exhumations and matching DNA samples with families of the missing. These findings sparked international concern prompting organizations like Human Rights Watch, Amnesty International, and the Office of the United Nations High Commissioner for Human Rights (OHCHR) called for transparent and independent investigations.²⁴ Amnesty International emphasized that 'the families of the disappeared have a right to know', framing the issue within the broader context of international human rights obligations. 25 However, translating these recommendations into action proved highly challenging for the Indian state. Operational

challenges in conflict-affected zones, the absence of a centralized DNA database, and security sensitivities surrounding the exhumation of graves posed major obstacles. State authorities reiterated that the majority of the graves were the result of encounters with foreign militants and cautioned against politically motivated narratives that could distort the realities of counter militancy efforts.

Ever since Pakistan launched a proxy war in Kashmir in the form of militant insurgency and terrorism, it has been on a constant propaganda roll. This war has been waged on multiple fronts. Beyond guns and armed infiltration, the Pakistan-sponsored proxy war has thrived on information warfare, psychological propaganda, indoctrination of young minds, and institutional subversion. Fake narratives and distorted discourses have been systematically propagated to sow dissatisfaction and hatred among Kashmiri youth toward India. Propaganda remains a central component of the terror insurgency unleashed by the Pakistani deep state and its local collaborators against the people of Kashmir and the Indian state at large. The Pakistani propaganda machinery operating in and on Kashmir has become highly sophisticated, availing the services of foreign militants, fifth columnists, propagandists, and so-called white-collar militants who manufacture fabricated narratives designed to provoke disaffection and legitimize violence. One such persistent narrative has been the claim of widespread unidentified mass graves in the Kashmir Valley. Over the past two decades, numerous accounts both journalistic and academic have circulated around this issue, often without offering verifiable or contextspecific evidence. Over time, these narratives have only grown more polarized. While human rights groups have continued to assert that the graves may contain civilians wrongfully killed, state agencies have acknowledged the humanitarian sensitivities but also emphasized the operational challenges and dangers inherent in a conflict zone marked by cross-border militancy. Militant groups and separatist networks, for their part, have actively exploited the imagery of unmarked graves to fuel propaganda, making sweeping allegations without credible substantiation. Media coverage has further complicated the issue; certain outlets, in their pursuit of sensationalism, have often portrayed all unmarked graves as sites of mass atrocities without individual verification. This approach has contributed more to public confusion than to clarity, deepening both domestic and international polarization on the matter.

The Dilemma: Classification of 'Foreign Militants'

Building on the complex realities discussed earlier, another significant challenge in the documentation and investigation of unidentified graves in Kashmir lies in the classification method most commonly practiced during active counter militancy operations in Kashmir. In the Kashmir context, identifying foreign militants has been a complex part of counter-militancy efforts. Due to the nature of militancy in the region, many individuals killed in security operations did not carry proper identification documents. In such cases, security forces had to rely on other methods to determine their origin. When no local records or familial ties could be verified, these individuals were classified as unidentified militants or foreign terrorists. However, over time, several signs helped distinguish nonlocal militants from local ones, particularly through the awareness and observations of the local population. Local residents frequently reported cases where these non-local militants issued threats to civilians, especially those suspected of cooperating with the authorities. In some instances, posters or pamphlets appeared in villages with the names, aliases, or affiliations of these individuals sometimes as a means of spreading fear or claiming responsibility for attacks. These public signs, combined with testimonies from villagers, and official inputs played a key role in helping authorities trace their non-local origins. Altogether, this ground-level information was crucial in confirming the identity of foreign militants and documenting their presence in the region.

This classification was typically based on circumstantial indicators such as physical appearance, possession of non-local items (for example, Pakistani brands), or the absence of local identity documents. Given the operational pressures of tracking cross-border infiltration and neutralizing immediate threats, such reliance on indirect evidence was, at times, a pragmatic necessity. However, this practice also carried an inherent risk of misclassification. Kashmir's complex socio-cultural landscape marked by cross-border terrorism sometimes blurred the lines between foreign infiltrators and local militants. Additionally, examples existed where local youth recruited into militant ranks, operated without formal documentation, further complicating the ability of Indian security agencies to accurately determine identity in counter militancy conditions. In such situations, the use of circumstantial markers while operationally justified under immediate threat conditions have unintentionally led to errors in classification. This confusion becomes particularly important when retrospectively examining the records of unidentified graves. While many

buried individuals were indeed likely foreign militants killed in legitimate encounters, the possibility that some misidentified locals were categorized and buried as 'foreign terrorists' cannot be entirely discounted without systematic forensic verification. Acknowledging this complexity does not diminish the broader security imperatives faced by the Indian state during the height of the militancy; rather, it highlights the need for nuanced, retrospective scrutiny to ensure that humanitarian concerns are balanced with the operational realities of counter militancy warfare. Understanding the limitations of classification practices during conflict years is essential not only for addressing the grievances of affected families but also for checking reinforcing the credibility of state institutions committed to upholding rule of law principles, even under high-risk situations.

Research Gap

In context of above discussion, the discourse around unmarked and unidentified graves in Jammu and Kashmir has long been shaped by polarized narratives that often fail to capture the full complexity of the conflict. Unlike mass grave situations in post-conflict societies like Iran, Bosnia or Rwanda where state-led repression was a defining cause the Kashmir context is different. Here, the existence of unmarked or unidentified graves is deeply tied to the operational realities of an ongoing militancy, cross-border terrorism, and counter militancy dynamics rather than any singular, systematic policy of repression. Throughout the militancy, militants especially those infiltrating from across the Line of Control frequently carried no identification. Security forces often had little choice but to carry out burial procedures. However, over time, advocacy groups and international organizations reframed these graves as symbols of systematic human rights violations. While their concerns about transparency and justice were valid in principle in some limited number of cases, many of these portrayals overlooked the specific security challenges and governance constraints that shaped burial practices during active conflict. Within Kashmir itself, local responses to the graves remain divided. While advocacy groups such as the Association of Parents of Disappeared Persons (APDP) have persistently called for investigation and accountability, particularly to address the emotions of families of the disappeared. Yet, for much of the broader civilian population having lived through decades of violence and instability the priorities today often center on economic recovery, development, and reconciliation rather than reopening highly sensitive grievances from the

past. Despite numerous studies, the existing literature on unmarked graves in Kashmir remains deeply polarized and often methodologically inconsistent. As discussed earlier, reports such as Buried Evidence (2009) and Alleged Perpetrators (2012), though presented as efforts to highlight concerns, were marked by selective field engagement and a heavy dependence on unverified oral testimonies. These accounts lacked adequate crossreferencing with official records and failed to conduct thorough verification across the multiple dimensions of the issue. These investigations tended to reflect a singular narrative focused primarily on state-perpetrated abuses, while giving insufficient attention to violence carried out by foreign militants or local militant groups. Unlike international best practices where credible mass grave investigations triangulate archival data, and multiple independent sources, the Kashmir-related reports often relied heavily on unverified testimonies, overlooked security archives, and avoided demographic cross-checks. Their language frequently used terms such as 'alleged extrajudicial killings' and 'possible' war crimes without presenting systematically corroborated evidence, thus reinforcing international misperceptions about the conflict without fostering a deeper understanding of its complexities.

Recognizing these gaps, the present study was conceptualized to offer a more methodologically rigorous, transparent, and ethically conscious documentation. The goal was to move beyond polarized narratives and engage directly with ground realities. The study sought to document unmarked graveyards systematically across conflict-affected districts, triangulate evidence from diverse sources including field observations, official records, and oral histories, and critically acknowledge the violence inflicted by both state and non-state actors. Rather than simplifying the conflict into binaries of victim and perpetrator, the report aimed to apply best rigorous research practices, carefully adapted to Kashmir's unique conditions as a live conflict zone. To realize this, the report focused the fieldwork on four districts—Baramulla, Kupwara, Bandipora, and Ganderbal. These areas were chosen for several reasons: their proximity to the *Line of Control* (LOC) made them hotspots for infiltration and counter militancy activity; historical records indicated frequent engagements and operations and to check the credibility of previous reporting which had identified them as concentrations of unmarked mass graves. By expanding the geographic scope beyond the limited zones previously studied, the research report attempts to correct the earlier biases and allows a more representative understanding of the issue.

Methodology

In context of the issue, the methodology for the report was deliberately kept layered and comprehensive. Fieldwork involved physical inspection of more than three hundred seventy-three graveyards, with systematic photographic documentation, geotagging, and careful recording of burial characteristics. Each grave was assessed for its marking, identifiers, and possible categorization. Alongside these observations, semi-structured interviews were conducted with a wide cross-section of the community: local clerics and members of Augaf (mosque) committees, gravediggers, families of local militants and disappeared persons, and long-surviving locals with knowledge of local burial practices. These narratives provided important oral histories, but every effort was made to crossverify them against documentary evidence wherever possible. Documentary analysis formed a parallel strand of research, involving the examination of First Information Reports (FIRs) related to encounters, wherever accessible. Community narratives were cross-referenced with official encounter reports to distinguish between local militants, foreign militants, and potential civilian casualties. In cases where prior forensic exhumations had been carried out such as in incidents of fake encounters acknowledged by the state these were studied carefully to understand both the possibilities and limitations of forensic identification under conflict conditions. The scope of this research report spans the period from 1990 to 2023, a timeframe marked by significant developments in the security landscape of Jammu and Kashmir. The extended timeframe allows for a comprehensive analysis of how practices of identification, particularly in cases of unidentified graves have evolved in response to operational realities.

Classification of Graves

To gain a clearer understanding of the issue of unmarked graves and to provide more accurate documentation, it was important to classify these graves. In this context, graves were categorized into five major categories: first, <u>identified local militants</u>, where full names and family ties were documented; second, <u>unidentified foreign militants</u>, usually based on partial identifiers or aliases (nicknames), local testimonies, testimonies from former release or surrendered local militants and official records, third, <u>unmarked graves</u>, characterized by the absence of markers or verifiable identifiers; and fourth, <u>civilian graves</u> and fifth, is <u>graves</u> of tribal invaders killed in 1947. The emphasis remained firmly

on case-specific analysis rather than sweeping generalizations, acknowledging the diversity of circumstances surrounding each death. By integrating desk-based research, structured fieldwork, community engagement, documentary analysis, and methodological triangulation, the report aims to provide a more credible, balanced, and human-centered account of unmarked graves in Kashmir. It resists simplistic narratives of state oppression or militant victimhood, recognizing instead that both the humanitarian consequences and security imperatives of conflict have left a complex legacy. Through this approach, the research aspires not only to fill critical gaps in existing literature but also to contribute to more informed, constructive discussions about Kashmir's past, present, and future.

Limitations of Study

Despite the extensive efforts made to ensure the thoroughness and balance of the report, several limitations must be acknowledged. Given the sensitive nature of the subject, the historical depth of the conflict, and the large volume of burial and encounter-related data, a certain degree of 'discrepancy' might be there. Access to classified security files particularly some 1990s cases including detailed operational records and encounter reports, remained restricted, which limited the ability to cross-verify all events independently. Additionally, potential biases in memory were also taken into consideration. Many of the testimonies collected were shaped by the passage of time, individual trauma, and the broader political context, all of which naturally influence personal recollections. While every attempt was made to triangulate sources and cross-validate information through field observations and documentary analysis, some margin of error remains inherent in any research conducted in such a fluid and contested environment. Rather than overlooking these challenges, this study openly foregrounds them, recognizing that its findings are provisional interpretations shaped by the complex realities of an ongoing conflict zone.

Conclusion

The issue of unmarked graves in Kashmir cannot be meaningfully addressed through ideological rhetoric, selective advocacy, or narrow accusations. Instead, it demands a patient, disciplined engagement with the complex historical, political, and humanitarian realities that have defined the region over decades of conflict. The study was designed

with precisely that commitment: to move beyond polarized narratives and approach the subject through systematic fieldwork, balanced documentation, and ethically responsible inquiry. Through this introductory chapter, the research has sought to establish the necessary context for understanding unmarked graves within the broader framework of Kashmir's prolonged militancy, cross-border interventions, and counter militancy operations. It recognizes that the conflict has produced difficult realities on multiple fronts: persistent external infiltration, verified instances of human rights violations, and immense civilian suffering caught between militant violence, security excesses and political uncertainty. Against this backdrop, unmarked graves emerge not merely as humanitarian concerns but as complex artifacts of a live and evolving conflict, shaped by operational necessities as well as human tragedy. Importantly, this study acknowledges that while many graves may relate to foreign militants who were killed during infiltration or combat, others may involve more complex local dynamics, including contested cases of disappeared civilians. Yet the absence of full access to classified security records and the inevitable challenges of retrospective verification underscores the need for careful, measured analysis rather than sweeping conclusions. The study consciously avoids simplistic generalizations, favoring case-specific understanding rooted in verifiable evidence, local testimonies, and administrative realities. Rather than closing the discussion, this chapter opens the space for deeper exploration. In the chapters that follow, the research moves into larger field-based documentation across four districts—Baramulla, Kupwara, Bandipora, and Ganderbal. Each district presents its own distinct conflict history, community narratives, and patterns of burial practices. Through these localized studies, the complexities hinted at in this opening chapter will be further unpacked, providing a richer, more nuanced view of how the phenomenon of unmarked graves is lived, remembered, and understood across different parts of Kashmir. By maintaining a balanced and fact-driven approach, this study hopes to contribute toward a more grounded and constructive understanding of the legacy of conflict—the study seeks not only to document the past but also to chart a way forward: one rooted in truth, justice, and dignity for all those affected by Kashmir's prolonged and tragic conflict.

Chapter 2

Dead, Disputed, and Disappeared: A Review of Unmarked Grave Studies

Introduction

The presence of unmarked graves in conflict zones has long been a subject of humanitarian, legal, and political concern. Across different parts of the world, such graves have been discovered in regions affected by state-led counter militancy operations, ethnic conflicts, insurgencies, and civil wars. Their existence raises fundamental questions about accountability, justice, and the complexities of war, often leading to forensic investigations, judicial inquiries, and international scrutiny. However, the narratives surrounding unmarked graves vary significantly based on the political context, security considerations, and the involvement of different actors. While human rights organizations often associate them with extrajudicial killings and enforced disappearances, states frequently frame them as consequences of armed conflict, attributing them to militants, war casualties, or unidentified infiltrators.

Jammu and Kashmir (J&K), a region marked by decades of political unrest, militancy, and counter-militancy operations, has been at the center of similar debates. Various human rights organizations and fact-finding bodies have claimed the discovery of thousands of unmarked graves in Kashmir, linking them to allegations of enforced disappearances and extrajudicial executions. Reports such as 'Buried Evidence' (2009) by the International People's Tribunal on Human Rights and Justice (IPTK) and 'Alleged Perpetrators' (2012) have argued that these graves 'may' contain the remains of civilians who went missing during counter-militancy operations. The Association of Parents of Disappeared Persons (APDP) and other human rights groups have long demanded independent forensic investigations, including DNA testing, to determine the identities of those buried. Conversely, the Indian government and security agencies have consistently maintained that these graves belong primarily to foreign militants and unidentified militants killed in encounters with security forces. Official investigations, such as the 2011 inquiry conducted by the Jammu and Kashmir government, acknowledged the presence of 3,844 unmarked graves but rejected allegations of systematic human rights violations. The

state's position highlights the operational challenges of counter militancy warfare, where identifying individuals in combat zones is difficult, and security concerns often take precedence over forensic investigations.

The academic and policy discourse on unmarked graves in J&K thus falls within a broader global debate on how states, international institutions, and human rights bodies interpret and investigate such sites in conflict regions. In Bosnia, forensic anthropology played a key role in uncovering war crimes and holding perpetrators accountable at the International Criminal Tribunal for the Former Yugoslavia (ICTY). In Latin America, organizations such as the Argentine Forensic Anthropology Team (EAAF) have pioneered scientific methodologies to identify victims and establish historical truth. In contrast, countries like Sri Lanka and Iraq have resisted international interventions, citing concerns over sovereignty and national security. These global examples provide important lessons for Kashmir, particularly regarding the role of forensic investigations, legal frameworks, and political considerations in addressing the issue of unmarked graves. This chapter contextualizes the issue of unmarked graves within global and regional perspectives, comparing how different conflict zones have approached similar challenges. It also critically examines the investigations conducted in J&K, the legal and forensic obstacles, and the responses of both Indian and international actors. Furthermore, it explores the complex policy dilemmas that arise when addressing human rights concerns in a region with an active militancy. Acknowledging both security imperatives and humanitarian considerations, this review seeks to provide a comprehensive and objective assessment of the evidence, investigative gaps, and competing narratives.

Global Perspectives on Unmarked Graves

The discovery of unmarked graves has long been a troubling phenomenon in regions marred by conflict, state repression, and militancy. From totalitarian regimes of the 20th century to modern-day counter militancy operations, these graves have often symbolized both the brutality of war and the complexities of justice. They raise fundamental questions about state responsibility, forensic accountability, and the politics of memory²⁶. While

some graves have been linked to ethnic cleansing and war crimes, others have been integral to counter militancy strategies, where rapid burial is framed as an operational necessity rather than a deliberate concealment of human rights violations.²⁷ In the case of Jammu & Kashmir, the debate over unmarked graves is deeply contested, with some reports alleging mass disappearances, while state authorities maintain that these sites primarily contain foreign militants and unidentified militants killed in crossfire.²⁸ However, to fully understand the nuances of this issue, it is essential to examine historical and contemporary parallels across the world, where states, insurgent groups, and international organizations have engaged in varying degrees of investigation, denial, and legal accountability. Throughout history, mass graves have often served as silent witnesses to conflicts those states either seek to erase or justify. In Francoist Spain, thousands of opponents of Francisco Franco's regime were executed and buried in unmarked sites between 1936 and 1975, with official narratives dismissing these as the necessary consequence of civil war²⁹. Decades later, efforts to exhume these graves faced political resistance, with the Spanish government arguing that disturbing the past would reignite tensions rather than promote justice.³⁰ A similar state-versus-memory struggle unfolded in Argentina after the fall of its military dictatorship in 1983, where forensic anthropology emerged as a tool to counter official denial. The Argentine Forensic Anthropology Team (EAAF) pioneered DNA identification methods to retrieve historical truth, laying the groundwork for subsequent forensic investigations in Bosnia, Guatemala, and Rwanda.

The situation in Bosnia and Herzegovina further illustrates how unmarked graves have been both a site of forensic discovery and political contestation. Following the Srebrenica massacre (1995), where over 8,000 Bosniak men and boys were systematically executed, forensic experts began exhuming mass graves and reconstructing identities using DNA technology (Wagner, 2008). Unlike Argentina, where forensic investigations were nationally driven, the Bosnian case was significantly influenced by international legal mechanisms, particularly the International Criminal Tribunal for the Former Yugoslavia (ICTY). The role of external oversight in unmarked grave investigations remains one of the most debated issues today—should states be left to investigate their own conflicts, or should international bodies intervene? This question is central to the Kashmir case, where calls for full-fledged documentation including forensic investigation have clashed with national sovereignty concerns.

Complexity of State Responses: Denial vs Justification

State reactions to unmarked graves are mostly shaped by political motivations, security considerations, and diplomatic pressures. In Sri Lanka, following the civil war (1983–2009), the discovery of mass graves prompted calls for accountability over alleged war crimes against Tamil separatists. Over the past three decades, various mass graves have been identified across Sri Lanka, while some where partially exhumed. Successive Sri Lankan governments have largely resisted international calls for comprehensive forensic investigations into these mass graves. In 2011, a United Nations panel reported 'credible allegations' of war crimes and crimes against humanity committed by both the Sri Lankan military and the Liberation Tigers of Tamil Eelam (LTTE) during the final stages of the civil war. The panel estimated that up to 40,000 civilians may have been killed, primarily due to indiscriminate shelling by government forces.³¹ Yet, successive Sri Lankan governments have resisted international forensic investigations, arguing that these graves contain legitimate war casualties rather than victims of extrajudicial killings.³² This

defensive posture mirrors the responses of many states facing insurgencies, where the line between counterterrorism and human rights violations remains ambiguous. Pakistan shows a clear double standard when it comes to human rights, especially in Balochistan. In this region, there have been many reports of mass graves and people going missing—allegedly taken by Pakistani security forces. 33 Over the years, Baloch activists and international human rights organizations have raised persistent concerns about enforced disappearances and extrajudicial actions within Pakistan, particularly in regions like Balochistan. Despite the gravity of these claims, credible investigations have remained limited or obstructed. 34 Simultaneously, Pakistan has sought to position itself as a strong advocate for human rights in Kashmir, frequently highlighting concerns such as unmarked graves and alleged disappearances. This contrast raises important questions. While Pakistan continues to project itself as a defender of human rights beyond its borders, particularly in Kashmir, a significant number of cases involving disappearances and unaccounted individuals within its own territory remain unacknowledged and under-investigated. The disparity in attention suggests that human rights discourse is, at times, selectively invoked—often shaped more by strategic interests than by a consistent commitment to justice and transparency.

Unlike cases of genocide or state repression, unmarked graves in counter-militancy settings often present a different set of challenges. In Iraq and Syria, the rise of ISIS and other terrorist groups has led to the discovery of mass graves containing both victims of ethnic and religious violence and militants killed during armed clashes. ³⁵ Investigations into these sites have been highly selective, with state-backed efforts focusing primarily on documenting ISIS crimes while neglecting graves linked to counter militancy operations.

Similarly, in Afghanistan, both the Taliban and counterterrorism forces have been accused of extrajudicial killings, yet unmarked graves linked to foreign military operations have rarely been scrutinized with the same intensity as those linked to insurgent violence.³⁶ This asymmetry in how grave sites are investigated based on the identity of the perpetrators remains a critical issue in global human rights discourse. In Kashmir, where cross-border terrorism and counter militancy operations have shaped the conflict, it is necessary to differentiate between victims of state violence and those killed in counter militancy as foreign militants—a distinction often blurred in human rights reports.

International Law and Selective Enforcement

International legal mechanisms have played a significant yet inconsistent role in addressing unmarked graves. While the ICTY and the International Criminal Court (ICC) have been instrumental in holding Bosnian and Rwandan war criminals accountable, similar calls for international scrutiny in Sri Lanka, Iraq, and Balochistan have been largely ignored due to geopolitical interests. This selective enforcement of accountability and war crimes prosecution reveals the politicized nature of international human rights advocacy, where cases that align with global political agendas receive greater attention. India's stand on documentation on unmarked or unidentified graves in Kashmir must be understood within this framework, a nation facing persistent cross-border terrorism cannot be expected to apply the same principles or openness as post-genocide societies. While documentation of these unmarked graves for verification purpose remains an important tool for truth-seeking, it must be balanced with security challenges, diplomatic concerns, and the risks of external political manipulation. The discourse on unmarked graves across the world reveals that state responses vary based on political stability, international pressure, and the nature of the conflict. From Argentina's forensic breakthroughs to Pakistan's suppression of investigations in Balochistan, from Bosnia's international tribunals to Sri Lanka's resistance to external scrutiny, the treatment of mass graves remains deeply contested and politicized. The situation in Kashmir fits within this larger pattern, where unmarked graves must be analyzed not just as isolated human rights issues but as part of a broader counter militancy challenges. In a region affected by decades of

terrorism, militancy, and daily military operations, the demand for full accountability and transparency must be tempered by realistic security concerns.

The presence of unmarked graves in Jammu & Kashmir (J&K) has generated intense debate both within and outside India, particularly in relation to counter militancy rules, legal protection, and human rights concerns. Given the region's complex history of militancy, these graves have been framed in competing ways, as evidence of enforced disappearances and extrajudicial killings by some, and as burial sites for 'unidentified' militants killed in military operations by others. The discourse surrounding these graves extends beyond local legal and human rights frameworks, touching on international humanitarian law, sovereignty, and counterterrorism strategies. The 2009 International People's Tribunal on Human Rights and Justice in Kashmir (IPTK) report identified 2,700 unmarked graves containing over 2,900 bodies across 55 villages in northern Kashmir. The report claimed that 87.9% of these bodies remained unidentified, raising concerns about potential extrajudicial killings. However, state authorities have strongly contested these allegations, maintaining that most of the deceased were foreign militants, particularly those who had infiltrated from across the Line of Control (LoC) with Pakistan. The government has argued that these burials were necessitated by the practical challenges of counter militancy warfare, wherein militants killed in counter militancy operations often lack proper identification and are not claimed by families, making their burial an operational necessity. The Jammu & Kashmir State Human Rights Commission (SHRC) conducted an official inquiry in 2011, which confirmed that 574 graves contained the bodies of local Kashmiris, while the remaining graves were presumed to belong to foreign militants. While this report gave limited credibility to claims that at least some disappeared individuals were buried in these sites, it also reinforced the state's assertion that the majority of those graves belong to militants.

From a legal standpoint, the existence of unmarked graves in Kashmir raises important questions about state responsibility, forensic accountability, and compliance with international law. Article 34(2)(b) of Additional Protocol I to the Geneva Conventions mandates the preservation and protection of grave sites in situations of armed conflict, while Article 16 of the First Geneva Convention (1949) requires parties to collect,

document, and properly mark the graves of those killed in conflict.³⁷ While human rights organizations argue that India has failed to uphold these obligations, the government maintains that counterterrorism operations in Kashmir fall within the realm of internal security governance, rather than an international armed conflict, making the direct applicability of these legal provisions more complex. Besides, the discourse on unmarked graves is also tied to broader theories of counter militancy governance and necropolitics, a concept introduced by Achille Mbembe to describe how states regulate life and death in conflict zones.³⁸ In the context of Kashmir, these dynamics have often been framed through the lens of security imperatives and the need to maintain public order in a volatile region.

There are two dominant perspectives regarding this issue. Some argue that the Indian state's approach to burial policies in Kashmir serves to regulate the post-death visibility of militants, preventing their deaths from becoming rallying points for separatist mobilization. An alternative perspective, however, considers how such policies have shaped the larger sociopolitical landscape, particularly for civilians caught between insurgent activity and counter militancy operations. By limiting public funerals and conducting burials in designated, often unmarked sites, the state has sought to prevent the glorification of militant figures, thereby reducing the likelihood of funerals becoming spaces for radicalization or violent mobilization. In a region where civilians frequently bear the brunt of both militant violence and daily counter militancy operations, such measures have contributed to dampening cycles of retaliatory violence, preventing further loss of life among the local population.

In most conflict zones, the line between militants and civilians often becomes blurred, leaving civilians in a precarious position. This blurring is often intensified by asymmetric

warfare tactics, where non-state actors mix into civilian populations.³⁹ In Kashmir, where militant groups have mostly attracted or motivated young people into militancy, the management of militant deaths, though often framed as a state security strategy, has also functioned as a protective mechanism for communities vulnerable to the manipulative tactics of militant groups. By minimizing the public displays of militant deaths especially foreign militants, the state has tacitly created conditions that have helped to shield civilians from cycles of retributive violence while ensuring that conflict dynamics do not escalate to a point where local populations suffer even greater instability. Besides, the civilian involvement in supporting roles to militants further complicates the problem.⁴⁰ While debates surrounding necropolitics and the management of unmarked graves in Kashmir remain complex, it is also necessary to examine how such policies have played a role in maintaining a degree of normalcy in an otherwise conflict-ridden landscape. For communities already burdened by years of militancy, economic disruptions, and political uncertainty, preventing militant deaths from becoming flashpoints for renewed violence has, in many ways, contributed to stabilizing everyday life in the region. Since 1989, Pakistan-based militant groups such as Lashkar-e-Taiba (LeT), Jaish-e-Mohammed (JeM), and Hizbul Mujahideen have been identified as key actors in fueling armed militancy in the region. 41 Apart from 'state' narrative, most local narratives suggest that a significant

proportion of those buried in unmarked graves were members of these groups, many of whom were not claimed by their handlers or families due to their foreign origins.

The discourse surrounding unmarked graves in Jammu & Kashmir (J&K) has been shaped by two competing narratives. On one hand, local NGOs and activist groups, argue that these graves contain the remains of civilians who were forcibly disappeared, highlighting the need for transparency and institutional accountability. 42 On the other hand, the state has consistently maintained that these sites primarily contain unidentified foreign militants, many of whom infiltrated from Pakistan-Occupied Kashmir (POK) and were never claimed by their handlers or families. This divergence in perspectives has complicated efforts to establish a standardized mechanism for addressing the issue, as both sides present differing interpretations of the identities and circumstances of those buried. One of the key challenges in addressing unmarked graves in J&K has been the absence of a clear legal and procedural framework for handling unidentified militants in an active conflict zone. Unlike post-conflict societies where truth and reconciliation mechanisms have played a role in addressing past grievances, Kashmir's status as an ongoing militancy-affected region has made large-scale documentation initiatives difficult. Additionally, security concerns and counter militancy priorities have meant that efforts to systematically examine these graves have often been perceived as potential security risks, particularly in a landscape where militant groups continue to exploit anti-state narratives. Another key factor appears to be the cross-border nature of militancy in Jammu and Kashmir. It is widely believed that a portion of the unmarked graves may contain the

remains of foreign militants, reportedly linked to groups such as Lashkar-e-Taiba (LeT) and Jaish-e-Mohammed (JeM), who were killed during armed engagements. However, due to the lack of verifiable records or formal claims of identity from across the border, many of these individuals remained unidentified, complicating efforts at accurate documentation and classification.

Conclusion

The issue of unmarked graves in Kashmir cannot be reduced to simplistic accusations of state-led human rights violations. Rather, it must be examined within the broader counter militancy framework, where graves result from a complex interplay of militant violence, security operations, and administrative limitations. This report does not dismiss concerns over potential wrongful killings or civilian disappearances. In the context of Kashmir, this study offers a field-based assessment that takes into account both humanitarian concerns and the on-ground security realities shaped by years of conflict. By including perspectives from affected families, local communities, and administrative sources, along with available information related to the security situation, the study aims to provide a more balanced and accurate understanding of the issue—moving beyond polarized narratives to support a fact-based, policy-relevant approach. The findings from this district-level study will constitute the first systematic, data-driven examination of unmarked and unidentified graves in Kashmir.

Chapter 3

Baramulla District

Introduction

Baramulla district, located in the northern reaches of Jammu and Kashmir, stands as one of the most contested sites of India's enduring counter militancy landscape in Kashmir valley. With its vast territorial spread of 524 villages⁴³ and a population exceeding one million⁴⁴, Baramulla has long been at the intersection of armed infiltration and civilian vulnerability. Its geopolitical location bordering the Line of Control (LoC) renders it a perpetual frontline in the decades-long conflict between state forces and insurgent networks, particularly those backed by Pakistan-based militant groups. Baramulla district shares a very close border with Pakistan-occupied Kashmir (PoK), and its location has played a significant role in various historical and contemporary events. During the tribal invasion of 1947, armed raiders from Pakistan entered the Kashmir Valley through this district, which marked the beginning of the first Indo-Pak war and the eventual accession of Jammu and Kashmir to India. 45 In later years, crossing points such as the Muzaffarabad Road and the Kamman Post in Kamalkote were reopened as confidence-building measures (CBMs) to allow divided families to reconnect and promote peace between India and Pakistan. 46 These developments highlight Baramulla's geographical closeness to PoK and its historical and strategic importance. This proximity, along with its difficult terrain and

porous borders, has made it a natural route for cross-border militant movement, especially since the surge in militancy in the 1990s.⁴⁷

Baramulla is not just important for security reasons it has also become a symbol of the larger conflict in Kashmir. Because of its location and constant threats of infiltration, the government has increased counter militancy operations in the area. These include heavy surveillance, cordon-and-search operations (CASO), and frequent encounters between armed forces and militants.⁴⁸ Many of these encounters occur without adequate documentation, particularly when the individuals killed carry no identification or remain unclaimed by their families. ⁴⁹ As seen in many reports, one of the most disturbing outcomes of these encounters is the presence of unmarked graves found in villages and forested areas of Baramulla. Unlike other post-conflict places/countries, where forensic work and legal efforts helped communities deal with the past, Kashmir is still caught in ongoing conflict. Here, unmarked graves are not just memories of past violence, they show that the violence is still happening. As findings indicate, the way these graves are handled usually reflects the pressures of counter terrorism rather than an intentional effort to hide the truth. However, the absence of clear procedures, systematic documentation, forensic testing, and reliable official records raises critical questions: Who were these individuals? Were they in fact militants, or could some have been civilians misidentified in the process?

The issue of unmarked graves in Baramulla has become a serious concern, both in India and at the international level. On one side, government officials say that most of these graves belong to unidentified foreign militants from groups like Lashkar-e-Taiba,

Hizbul Mujahideen, Jaish-e-Mohammed, and Al-Badr who were killed in encounters or during cross-border attacks and could not be identified or claimed by families. On the other hand, many 'activist groups' believe that some of the graves 'might' belong to local civilians who went missing, were wrongfully detained, or killed by mistake. Because there have been no proper investigations, such as forensic testing or official records, there is still no clear proof about who is buried in these graves. This has raised serious questions about accountability and justice. Groups like Amnesty International, Human Rights Watch, and even the United Nations have asked the Indian government to investigate these graves properly and ensure transparency. In Kashmir, these graves are not just about the past, they are a reminder that the conflict is still ongoing, and that many families are still waiting for answers⁵. To answer these questions, we visited more than 19 graveyards in Baramulla and spoke with local clerics, Augaf members, grave diggers, and local residents. We also looked at police records, FIRs, and testimonies from families who had lost someone. This chapter connects the theories discussed earlier, about the state, conflict, and burial practices with what was actually seen and heard in Baramulla.

Field Engagement

The study commenced with a rigorous desk-based mapping exercise, drawing from existing media archives, human rights reports, local testimonies, and earlier documentation efforts by various NGOs. Preliminary mapping allowed the team to identify specific zones of interest, particularly those lying near the Line of Control, areas with a high frequency of recorded encounters, and locations flagged in oral testimonies for suspicious or unaccounted burials. Particular emphasis was placed on ensuring geographical diversity and cross-verification potential, which led to the selection of five key locations, Uri, Boniyar, Bijhama, Gulmarg, and Sheeri, each representing distinct topographical, security, and demographic profiles within Baramulla district. To ensure meaningful engagement and ethical interaction with local populations, the field team collaborated with trusted intermediaries, community elders, mosque committee members, and local volunteers. These individuals played a dual role: they helped mitigate fear and suspicion among potential respondents and assisted the research team in interpreting socio-cultural cues that would otherwise would have remained invisible. Given the legacy of fear of both state

surveillance and non-state retaliation establishing local trust was not just a methodological necessity, but a moral imperative.

Data collection was conducted using a set of qualitative and documentation tools designed to triangulate observations and reduce bias. The core method involved semi-structured interviews with a range of local actors including gravediggers, Augaf (mosque) committee members, residents living near to graveyards, people who participated in funerals and family members of the militants/disappeared. In many cases, photographic documentation and geotagging of graveyards were carried out to establish visual and spatial evidence of burial patterns. Particular care was taken in photographing grave markers, layouts, and any inscriptions that might aid future verification. Where possible, archival material such as First Information Reports (FIRs), local police station logs, press coverage, and lists of killed or apprehended militants maintained by security agencies were cross-referenced with field observations. This cross-referencing was especially vital in attempting to distinguish between local and foreign militants a classification often made based on recovered identification documents, local popularity, physical features, or belongings found with the deceased. The sections that follow build on the evidence collected through this field engagement, offering both a quantitative and narrative account of unmarked grave distribution, burial practices, and the contested meanings attached to these sites.

Classification of Graves

An essential aspect of the field study involved the classification of graves, which emerged as both a technical necessity and a deeply interpretive process. Graveyards across Baramulla displayed a complex typology of burial practices shaped by the evolving nature of conflict, community beliefs, and administrative inconsistencies.⁵⁰. Graves were

Administrative inconsistencies in the documentation and management of graves in Baramulla have been widely noted. The absence of standardized procedures for recording and verifying unidentified burials—often due to limited forensic infrastructure, conflict pressures, and rapid burial practices—has resulted in irregularities. Field investigations and reports by activist groups such as the *International People's Tribunal on Human Rights and Justice in Kashmir (IPTK)* and *Association of Parents of Disappeared Persons (APDP)* have also highlighted significant administrative failures in the management and documentation of unidentified graves. In many instances, there was a lack of systematic record-keeping, inconsistent procedures for identification, and little to no forensic verification. These lapses have been noted as contributing to the confusion around the identities of those buried, blurring the distinction between foreign militants and local civilians. categorized into broad types using visual markers, inscriptions, headstones, and local oral testimonies. This classification was supplemented with additional indicators, including recovered documents, community perceptions regarding whether the deceased were identified as local or foreign militants, and the occurrence of public funerals or protests for prominent militants.

In Baramulla district, unidentified or unmarked graves were the most frequently observed, generally lacking names, headstones, or other identifying features. While the absence of markers can partly be explained by cultural and religious practices in Kashmir where Islamic jurisprudence discourages elaborate grave markers even ancestral graves in local communities often lack inscriptions, making intergenerational identification difficult. Field research indicates that the prevalence of unidentified and unmarked graves intensified during the armed conflict of the 1990s, particularly for foreign militants killed in security operations without reliable identification. Families often did not claim these bodies, either because the deceased were not local or due to communication difficulties in the 1990s and early 2000s. Consequently, local authorities and communities frequently buried such individuals in peripheral sections of existing graveyards, sometimes with partial identifiers such as initials, aliases, or occasional dates. In several cases, inscriptions like *shaheed* (martyr) suggested possible links to militant groups, though definitive verification was not available.

By contrast, graves attributed to local militants were generally more distinctly marked, often including names, parentage, village affiliation, and dates of death. Almost every village maintained a designated area known locally as *Shaheed Makbar* (Martyr Graveyard) for the burial of militants, both local and foreign. The allocation of these dedicated spaces reflects the social and political significance attributed to such burials within the local context. Community practices suggest that those interred—whether identified locals or unidentified foreign combatants were recognized as having engaged in armed resistance against the Indian state, with the burial sites serving as a symbolic expression of respect, a practice particularly prominent during the 1990s. These graves occupied more central or familiar plots and were frequently visited by family members or local supporters. However, there are some documented cases, where individuals labeled in security documents as 'foreign terrorists' were locally remembered as village residents,

laborers, or individuals with mental health conditions who had gone missing. In many graveyards, the team encountered mixed sites spaces where civilians and militants, both locals and foreigners, shared burial grounds. These sites often revealed the blurred lines between militancy, suspicion, and mistaken identity that have long defined the conflict's social landscape. Community narratives frequently diverged from the official version of events. Local memory, shaped by oral history and lived experience, often painted a more nuanced or contradictory account of who the dead were and how they had come to be buried there.

Site-by-Site Documentation of Contested Graveyards in Baramulla

This section presents detailed field observations from over nineteen graveyard sites across Baramulla district. The documentation is organized geographically to reflect the diversity of burial practices and the patterns emerging from community interactions, topographical distribution, and archival records. Each site is examined through a combination of visual surveys, interviews, archival cross-verification, and available testimonies.

Graveyard at Bemiyaar, Boniyar


Situated near Warikhah behind the Primary Health Centre (PHC) Warikhah, Uri, the graveyard at Bemiyaar represents a characteristic example of burial practices that emerged during the high-intensity phases of militancy in the late 1990s and early 2000s. This site is not formally listed in official records, a reflection of the fact that many of its burials occurred during periods of heightened conflict when formal record-keeping was both difficult and deprioritized in favor of operational and logistical response. Our team visited Bemiyaar, a prominent area in Boniyar Tehsil of District Baramulla, where we identified a graveyard located behind the Primary Health Centre (PHC) Warikhah, Uri. During the visit, we observed approximately 130 graves, out of which 123 are unmarked and 6 belongs to local militants, and one grave belong to one civilian namely Bashir Ahmad Dar. Interactions with local residents revealed a consistent narrative, though many were hesitant to disclose their identities due to security concerns. According to elderly villagers, the graves belong to individuals, many believed to be unidentified militants or infiltrators, who were killed in encounters and cross-border incidents over the past decades. Given its

proximity to the Line of Control (LoC) and Pakistan-occupied Kashmir (PoK), the Uri sector has witnessed frequent conflict-related activity.

Local elders, village *Lambardars*, and village *Chokidars* reported that most of those buried in the graveyard were killed near the border and could not be identified. It remains unclear whether the deceased were locals or foreigners. They further stated that during the peak of militancy, many local Kashmiris crossed into PoK for training and weapons. A significant number were killed while attempting to infiltrate or return and were later buried in this graveyard. According to these accounts, some graves were exhumed in the past, and it was confirmed that the individuals were local residents who had died during infiltration. Burials were reportedly overseen by local residents, especially Ata Mohammad Khan, son of Wali Mohammad Khan, with the help of fellow villagers. Ata Mohammad Khan passed away around 6 to 7 years ago, making direct verification of these accounts difficult. Due to the lack of internet, camera equipment, or formal documentation at the time, there is no official record of the identities of most of the deceased. Despite the anonymity, the local community performed funeral rites and prayers, upholding religious and cultural traditions as best as possible under the circumstances. At present, only seven graves have nameplates. These are:

- 1. Abdul Qayoom Mir, son of Sikandar Mir, resident of Dolanja, Uri, Baramulla. Killed on 11 July 2004 (Sunday).
- 2. Farooq Ahmed Teli, son of Habib Ullah Teli, also known as Arif Kashmiri. Killed on 2 October 2003 (Thursday).
- 3. Farooq Ahmed Sheikh, son of Abdul Ahad Sheikh, also known as Akash Kashmiri, resident of Moza Kunzir, Tangmarg, Baramulla. Killed in August 2003.
- 4. Farooq Ahmed Sofi, son of Mohammad Akbar Sofi, resident of Parigam, Pulwama. Killed on 25 August 2003.
- 5. Javed Iqbal Khan, resident of Ali Alpora, Shopian. Killed on 23 August 2003
- 6. Fayaz Ahmed, son of Abdul Samad
- 7. Bashir Ahmed Dar, son of Ghulam Mohideen Dar, resident of Jalshiri, Baramulla. Killed on 25 July 2004.

These individuals were reportedly residents of nearby districts and some from nearby villages. We verified these names from the nameplates and spoke with residents from their native villages. It was confirmed that most of them were local militants who had either joined militant ranks or were killed while attempting to infiltrate. Some were active militants at the time of their deaths. Their graves included complete details such as names, parentage, and village origin, distinguishing them from others buried anonymously. Photographs 3.1 and 3.4 show the contrast in grave markings and spatial arrangement.





One notable case is that of Bashir Ahmed Dar, son of Ghulam Mohideen Dar, a resident of Jalshiri, Baramulla. He went missing in 2004 under unclear circumstances. According to local testimonies, he disappeared suddenly from his home, and no one knew whether he had joined any militant group or what had happened to him. His family was left in deep uncertainty, with no official information or evidence regarding his whereabouts. Sometime later, locals informed his father that a few unidentified bodies had recently been brought by security personnel and buried in the village graveyard. Holding on to hope, Ghulam Mohideen approached the local gravedigger to ask about the burials. The gravedigger recalled the bodies he had buried and, during their conversation, described one in particular, his physical appearance, the clothes he was wearing, and a neck chain that stood out. As the gravedigger spoke, Ghulam Mohideen recognized the details as those of his missing son. Though there was no official confirmation, the description matched so closely that he became certain it was Bashir. In that quiet exchange at the graveyard, a father found both sorrow and end of Bashir's story.

It is said that during the height of militancy, many individuals crossed the border without informing their families. Some were killed while crossing, others while returning. In several cases, families only learned of their fates much later, often when bodies were recovered and buried.

The presence of these marked graves within a site largely characterized by anonymity serves to illustrate the distinction often made by local communities between 'known sons of the soil' and 'outsiders' believed to be involved in transnational militant operations. It also reflects a nuanced understanding among locals, an ability to differentiate between individuals involved in conflict and the broader implications of that conflict on their daily lives. One elderly resident, recalling the early 2000s, remarked:

We didn't even know who these people were, but they were buried with prayer, like anyone else. That was our duty.

This sentiment was echoed in several interviews, emphasizing that religious obligations were upheld regardless of the identity or origin of the deceased. The provision of burial in accordance with Islamic practice was facilitated by community members and religious committees, even in the most uncertain of times. Notably, there was no evidence of forced concealment or mass grave pits at the site. Each grave was individual, arranged in simple rows, and maintained with basic care. While documentation gaps exist, especially in identifying foreign militants, this appears to reflect the complexity of counter militancy environments rather than any systematic neglect. The operational tempo during this period, combined with the fluid nature of cross-border infiltration, meant that rapid burial was often a necessity dictated by health, security, and logistical considerations.


The Bemiyaar graveyard, therefore, offers a focused example of how local communities, even in remote areas, balanced religious responsibilities with the realities of conflict. It also illustrates the state's efforts to ensure burial processes were conducted respectfully, despite the challenges posed by anonymity, lack of identification, and the high frequency of fatal engagements in the region. In many ways, the site embodies the layered history of

Baramulla: a region that has witnessed the overlapping pressures of infiltration, counter militancy, and civil resilience. As the documentation continues in the following sections, similar themes recur, community care amid crisis, procedural complexity in real-time conflict, and the quiet endurance of local ethics under pressure.

Boniyar Graveyard near Police Station

Located next to the Boniyar Police Station in Uri Tehsil, this site is an unmarked graveyard containing around fifteen graves with no identifying markers. Field documentation and photographs (see Pictures 3.8 and 3.9) confirm that the graves are anonymous and unmarked. While the identities of those buried remain unknown, local religious groups and Auqaf committee members ensured that basic Islamic burial rites were performed. Community members noted that even without knowing who the deceased were, efforts were made to maintain religious respect. The Boniyar Police Station graveyard, therefore, represents a small but significant thread within the larger network of unmarked burial sites in Baramulla

Graveyard Near Forest Rest House, Boniyar

Tucked behind the Forest Rest House in Boniyar, the graveyard comprises fifteen unmarked graves (see Pictures 3.9–3.11) bearing no inscriptions, dates, or physical markers to identify those buried. The site is quiet, isolated, and almost forgotten its anonymity not only physical but institutional. The research team initially identified the site through references in unofficial field reports and later verified its existence during onground visit. From the outset, what stood out was not just the lack of inscriptions, but the absence of memory. Conversations with locals and caretakers yielded no recollections, no stories, no local associations, not even second-hand narratives. This silence was striking. In other sites, however limited, fragments of memory or rumor persisted. Here, there was nothing. Thus, the absence of primary or secondary information from the field resulted in their classification and categorization as unmarked graves.

Lund Baidan Trikanjan Graveyard

Situated into a quiet hillside in Trikanjan, Uri Tehsil, the Lund Baidan graveyard holds five unmarked graves (see Pictures 3.11–3.13). These graves, though very small in number, are examples of a common pattern observed in some areas of North Kashmir where some individual graves are without any meaningful information in the public record. The Lund Baidan site stands in stark contrast to other burial grounds in the area, where field investigators have typically been able to reconstruct partial narratives through community recollections, witness testimonies, or basic official records. The absence of basic documentation protocols, combined with a lack of community memory or witness accounts, led us to categorize this site under unmarked grave category.

Peerbela Trikanjan, Boniyar

The graveyard at Peerbela Trikanjan in Boniyar, Uri Tehsil, features four unmarked graves (see Picture 3.14). These graves were identified during field verification and confirmed by local residents, though no accompanying testimonies were offered regarding the names, backgrounds, or timeframes associated with the burials. The origin of these four graves remains unknown, and neither state records nor community memory could fill the informational gap about them.

Bijhama Graveyard

The graveyard at Bijhama, located along a major route in Uri Tehsil, presents a distinct case in this study due to its mixed composition and dual function as both a community graveyard and a burial space for individuals killed in conflict (see Pictures 3.15–3.17). According to official records and local testimony there are twenty-eight graves out of which twenty-five belong to foreign militants (Details in Table 3.1), and three local militants (Details in Table 3.2) each supported by procedural documentation, including First Information Reports (FIRs) and records indicating their non-local origin. The inclusion of such records is relatively uncommon among graveyards surveyed in this field study and indicates a more structured response in certain cases where identification was feasible.

Lachipora Graveyard

In Lachipora, we documented four main graveyards namely Dachwara Lachipora, Lachipora, Watadi Lachipora and Lachipora Nallah, all situated in a forested stretch of Uri Tehsil. Around seventeen graves were documented, comprising both foreign and local militants (see Picture 3.17). Of these, 14 are unidentified graves have been categorized here as foreign militants (Details in Table 3.4), while the remaining three belong to local Kashmiri militants, whose graves are clearly marked with names and familial details in table 3.3:

The marked graves, positioned toward the inner edge of the site, distinguish themselves through the visible presence of headstones and floral markers. Unlike many other sites visited during this study, Lachipora stands out for its relatively complete official record. Official records associated with this site include First Information Reports (FIRs), proof of identity and residence, and documented dates of the encounters that led to the deaths. This

level of formal record-keeping provides a clearer trace of the burial process and the classification of those buried. Local testimonies offered further detail and corroboration. Locals confirmed that the three local militants buried here were from the nearby region and had been killed in encounters with security forces in surrounding forested zones. Funeral prayers for these individuals were attended by members of the community, indicating a degree of public acknowledgment and familial participation in the burial.

Ziyarat Shareef Rawatpora, Lachipora

Nestled near a locally revered shrine, the graveyard at Ziyarat Shareef Rawatpora in Lachipora holds nine graves attributed to foreign militants (see Pictures 3.19–3.21). What distinguishes this site from many others documented during fieldwork is not the number of graves or their composition, but the presence of an unusually detailed and community-maintained burial record.

During field visits, members of the local Auquaf Committee shared a handwritten register listing information about each burial. Entries included approximate dates of burial, references to burial names reportedly used during communication with local authorities.

Zamzampora, Sheeri Narvaw

During our visit to Zamzampora, Sheeri Narvaw, we came across a local graveyard near Masjid Abu Bakar, where three individuals are buried, two unidentified foreign militants and one unmarked. According to local testimonies, the first two bodies were earlier buried after being handed over to the Auqaf Committee by the local police. The identities of these individuals have been disclosed as Foreign Militants, who were killed in encounter in the same district in nearby area. Their religious funeral rites were properly performed for them, in accordance with Islamic traditions. The third unmarked grave belong to unidentified individual whose body was recovered from the Jhelum River near Kitchama. Upon notification by the locals, the police ensured the body was buried at the same site. This individual, too, was unidentified, and proper religious funeral rites were observed. These incidents reportedly took place in the early 2000s, based on the accounts of local residents

Badmulla, Sheeri: Graves Near the Shrine

During our visit to the village of Badmulla, Sheeri, located in Block Narvaw, District Baramulla, we discovered four unidentified graves in the local graveyard near the local shrine of Badmulla. According to locals, these bodies are believed to be of unidentified foreign militants. They shared that an encounter took place in 1995, at night, in the local forest area of Deedaar Bagh, Badmulla. The locals stated that approximately four unidentified militants were killed during the encounter, which lasted the entire night. They reported hearing the sounds of mortar shells and gunshots, and by morning, the encounter had ended. A large number of weapons were recovered by the security forces, and the bodies of the four militants were later handed over to the local masjid committee in 1995. The militants were then buried in the Badmulla graveyard, near the local shrine, and many locals participated in the funeral.

Graveyard in Fatehgarh, Sheeri Narvaw

In nearby Fatehgarh, a graveyard located behind the local market, which includes a distinct section designated for the burial of militants. Based on local accounts, this portion

of graveyard was established around 1994.⁵¹ Before this, militants were buried in their ancestral local graveyard. The graveyard contains a total of nine graves, of both militants and local civilians:

- Five identified local militants of Hizbul Mujahideen.
- Two foreign nationals, believed to be Afghan militants.
- Two civilians, reportedly killed by militants

<u>Graves of Local Militants</u>: The first three militants as shown in table 3.6 were killed on the same day during a joint encounter at Namblan on 16 June 1993:

• Nazir Ahmed Sheikh S/O Mohammad Akbar Sheikh, R/O Fatehgarh and Bashir Ahmed Lone, S/O Wali Mohammad Lone resident of Fatehgarh, sheeri Narwaw. According to local testimonies both these civilians were reportedly killed by Hizbul Mujahideen. They are buried along these militants.

<u>Graves of Foreign Militants</u>: Two unidentified militants believed to be Afghani nationals, were reportedly killed in an encounter around 2005. They were also buried in this graveyard. The police handed over their bodies to the local masjid committee, and their funerals were attended by the entire village.

Notable Incident: The Lone Family of Fatehgarh

One of the most revealing cases uncovered during the fieldwork is that of the Lone family from Fatehgarh, Sheeri, a deeply tragic story that exposes the brutal coercion exerted by militant groups on civilian populations during the peak of the armed militancy. Far from the often-one-dimensional portrayals of Kashmir's conflict, this case exemplifies the

complex, often deliberately overlooked reality of civilian victimhood at the hands of non-state actors (here militants). In June 1992, Bashir Ahmed Lone, S/O Wali Mohammad Lone resident of Fatehgarh, sheeri Narwaw was killed by militants. As per locals, he was a respected community member, and was shot dead by militants shortly after offering Isha prayers on 9th June 1992. He was shot twice and died on the spot. The reason was as chilling as it was telling: he refused to allow his brothers to join the ranks of Hizbul Mujahideen, a Pakistan-backed militant outfit operating in the region at the time. Further local narratives revealed that local Hizbul Mujahideen militants had threatened the family, saying:

'Dig two more graves. We will kill two more from your family.'

Abduction and Disappearance of Bashir Ahmad Lone's Two Brothers in June 1993: Around June 1993, the same Hizbul Mujahideen militants reportedly returned to the Lone family and abducted two more brothers of Bashir Ahmad Lone (as shown in Table 3.7), in line with their earlier threat:

Reason for the Killings and Disappearances: As per local sources, Hizbul Mujahideen militants had forced the family to send one of the sons to join their ranks. When the family refused, the militants killed Bashir Ahmed Lone and later abducted and disappeared his two brothers, Ghulam Mohiuddin and Abdul Rashid Lone, in 1993.

<u>Injury to Saja Begum (Mother of the Disappeared Sons)</u>: Locals also reported that Saja Begum, mother of above three victims, attempted to intervene and prevent the militants from abducting her sons. In retaliation, she was shot in the leg by the militants. Despite her injuries, her two sons were taken and disappeared, and their bodies have never been recovered.

These were not the actions of state agencies; they were carried out by armed militants who sought to impose ideological obedience on families through fear and targeted killings. This incident, remembered with searing clarity by villagers, dismantles the dominant narrative that casts all forms of violence in Kashmir as state-driven. The violence inflicted upon the Lone family was not the collateral damage of crossfire, but a premeditated act of punishment against a family that dared to say no. Their only 'crime' was to withhold a son from a militant group, an act of personal agency that was met with collective retribution. As one surviving relative told the research team:

'We were not with the army. We were not spies. We just said no.'

The above statement encapsulates the harsh binary imposed on Kashmiri civilians during the height of militancy: neutrality was not tolerated. In areas under militant influence, refusing to participate was often construed as betrayal: punishable by death, disappearance, or both. In zones where militant dominance replaced legal order, families were left to defend themselves or suffer the consequences of non-compliance. It is this complex landscape that challenges the reductive frameworks found in several earlier reports. While those accounts often foreground cases of state violence, they leave insufficient room for stories like that of the Lone family stories that reveal the devastating cost paid by ordinary people for resisting militant demands. These omissions are not accidental; they reflect a selective engagement with Kashmir's history, one that fails to capture the full spectrum of coercion endured by civilians. The Lone family's story, preserved through local testimony and documented in this report decades later, stands as a stark reminder: in Kashmir's shadow war, victimhood was not confined to one side.

Graveyard at Kitchama, Sheeri Baramulla

Situated near the Primary Health Centre in Sheeri, the graveyard at Kitchama is among the most substantial and symbolically significant sites surveyed during field study. With approximately 110 graves, almost all of them unmarked, this site bears material witness to the intensity of militancy and the corresponding counter militancy response that defined the late 1990s and early 2000s in Baramulla district. These numbers were also confirmed by Auqaf members and local gravediggers. During the extended fieldwork at the site, a

key informant, who requested anonymity for security reasons, revealed that he had personally participated in the burial of over 70 individuals here. His firsthand account provides important insight into the site's significance. In one particularly striking instance, he recounts, that a deceased militant's body carried a label that read Dr. Talha from Karachi, offering rare physical confirmation of the foreign affiliation of militants from Pakistan.

The burials span a period from approximately 1996 to 2003, aligning with the years of highest militant infiltration across the Line of Control (LoC). Local narratives consistently pointed to Kitchama as a key site for burying militants killed in encounters who lacked any familial presence in the area. These were individuals brought in by security forces (mostly local police) following encounters, and handed over to local clerics and Auqaf committees for burial. While the scale of this graveyard is notable, what is equally significant is the operational context in which it was created. The absence of First Information Reports (FIRs) for many of these cases makes sense when we look at the security situation in the late 1990s and early 2000s. During that time, the main priority for the administration was to deal with constant threats, protect people, and control the situation quickly. Detailed paperwork and formal reporting often took a back seat because survival and immediate action were more important.

One gravedigger recounted a striking incident from an encounter in the Gulmarg sector of Baramulla during the 1990s, in which three militants were killed. While preparing one of the bodies for burial, he discovered a live grenade strapped to the abdomen of the deceased. He narrates:

We once received a body from the Gulmarg sector, he recalled. As I prepared it for burial, I found a live grenade strapped to the man's abdomen. We removed it carefully and handed it over to the police.⁵²

According to local *Auqaf* members, there were also instances where the bodies brought for burial were severely burnt may be due to the intensity of the encounters, making identification impossible. Despite this, the remains were buried in the same graveyard after performing the required burial rituals. Local testimonies consistently indicated that none

of the deceased were identified as local residents at the time. Most were believed to be foreign nationals, based on their physical features, clothing, and the items recovered with their bodies.

The general anonymity of the graveyard was briefly interrupted during 2003–2004, when three bodies initially buried as unidentified were later confirmed to be locals from Srinagar. Once their identities were verified, state authorities took immediate steps to exhume the bodies and return them to their families for reburial. This rare but important incident demonstrates that the system despite challenges was not indifferent to accountability or correction. It highlights the willingness of the state to act responsibly when identification became possible. Unlike the more contested narratives often found in 'external sponsored' reporting, Kitchama represents a structured, though reactive, burial system developed in response to a high-threat environment. The presence of over 110 unidentified graves does not mean there was any hiding or wrongdoing. Instead, it shows how large the number of foreign militants was in Kashmir during that time. Infiltration across the border was happening often, and many of these militants were sent from across the border and were motivated by strong religious and political beliefs and after their death no one came forward to claim them even their families.

Located in the village of Parastan near TV Tower in Uri Tehsil, this graveyard stands as a well-documented site (see Pictures 3.23–3.26). Unlike many other sites documented in Baramulla district marked by partial records, this graveyard demonstrates a relatively high level of transparency, community oversight, and record-keeping in the handling of militant casualties. During on-ground documentation a total of seventeen graves were identified, all linked to militants killed in encounters with Indian security forces. According to documentation cross-verified with local testimonies (see Table 3.8), ten graves belong to foreign militants, while the remaining seven graves are those of local Kashmiri militants. The precise identification of these individuals including time, location of encounters, and the militant affiliations involved was possible due to the availability of supporting documentation and the consistent role played by the local Auqaf Committee in maintaining burial records.

Unlike earlier periods marked by limited communication and institutional strain, this site reflects a phase of increased procedural documentation and community-state coordination in managing the situation after militant encounters. Bodies were received by the Auqaf Committee following official handover by police or security personnel, and burials were carried out in line with Islamic practices under the committee's supervision. The presence of marked (local militants) and unidentified (foreign militants) graves side by side reveals the dual nature of the conflict: a persistent influx of foreign militants operating alongside local recruits. It also underscores the state's consistent procedural response ensuring dignified burial and documentation.

Graveyard at Nagin near Gulmarg

Situated near the world-famous tourist destination of Gulmarg in Tangmarg Tehsil, the graveyard at Nagin presents a subtle but significant layer in the broader landscape of conflict-related burial sites across Baramulla district (see Pictures 3.27 and 3.29). The location of this site is just miles away from one of India's most visited hill stations underscores the proximity of conflict to areas typically perceived as distant from zones of violence. During the field visit, we identified three unmarked graves, all devoid of

inscriptions or formal record. Local police authorities confirmed the absence of any institutional documentation related to these burials, and no entries were found in official registers. However, testimonies gathered from long-term residents of Nagin village helped fill in some of the historical gaps. According to local accounts, the graves belong to foreign militants allegedly killed in **2009**, during an attempted infiltration across the Line of Control (LoC).

Gantamulla Graveyard, Sheeri

Located in Gantamulla village block Narwaw, Sheeri in North Kashmir, the Gantamulla graveyard stands out as one of the most expansive and publicly referenced burial sites in the Kashmir Valley (see Picture 3.29). With approximately <u>265 graves</u>, (see table 3.9) the site contains a mix of foreign militants (155), local militants (105), and some civilians (5). It is situated adjacent to the National Highway and lies along the forested belt of Sheeri, an area historically affected by infiltration routes and frequent military engagements.

The graveyard has been in use since the early 2008s, and over time, it has evolved into a focal point in the discourse around burial practices, identity, and accountability in conflict zones. Its scale and visibility have drawn attention not only from local residents and religious bodies but also from national and international media. As a result, Gantamulla has frequently been cited in early media narratives as a suspected 'mass grave' site, claims that, while sensational, have often overlooked the extensive documentation and verification available for most of those buried here. Reports (FIRs), police encounter reports, family statements, and the memories of local Auqaf and Mosque Committee members, who kept informal burial registers or recalled details from memory. In many cases, families of the deceased still visit the graveyards to offer prayers, helping to confirm

the identities over time. We also found two graves, and unlike the others, they belong to civilians, one is an infant, and the other is Hazim Shafi Bhat. The systematic nature of documentation at Gantamulla distinguishes it from other remote or inaccessible sites across Baramulla. Table 3.2, appended to this report, details the identities, affiliations, and encounter references for the verified graves, further undermining claims of mass anonymity or institutional neglect.

During the different phases of field visit, the we interviewed the site's long-serving gravedigger, a 55-year-old man who has been performing burials at Gantamulla since its establishment. His testimony offered invaluable insight into the day-to-day burial process and the ethical norms consistently followed by the local committees:

- All bodies, regardless of identity, are given full Islamic funeral rites, including ghusl (washing), kafan (shrouding), and janazah prayers in presence of family members and relatives of local militants.
- Burials are coordinated between the gravedigger, family, Masjid Committee, and Auqaf Committee, with clear division of responsibilities and record-keeping.
- While official documents guide most burials, the gravedigger also maintains a mental record of several "known" individuals, indicating a form of informal community archiving.

In his own words:

'One time, I buried an infant,' he said. 'I found the dead body in the Jhelum River.

No one came to claim him.'

Case Study: Hazim Shafi Bhat (Serial Number 156), the Second Civilian Burial at the Site On May 4, 2020, a tragic encounter unfolded at Wangam crossing, near Khaipora in Handwara, Kupwara district, resulting in the death of 14-year-old Hazim Shafi Bhat, son of Mohammad Shafi Bhat, a resident of Khaipora. The incident occurred during a militant attack on a CRPF checkpoint, which led to the deaths of three CRPF personnel. Hazim, who had a minor physical disability, was in a nearby apple orchard at the time and was unable to flee when the firing began. Caught in the crossfire, he was fatally shot. Local residents and eyewitnesses later confirmed that Hazim had no involvement in the confrontation. Many recalled seeing him regularly in the area, noting that he was not mentally well and often wandered aimlessly around the village. His death was widely regarded as accidental and deeply mourned by both the state and community.

Following the incident, controversy emerged over the handling of Hazim's body. Due to COVID-19 restrictions in place at the time, authorities refused to release the body to his family, citing concerns over large funeral gatherings. Instead, Hazim was buried in Sheeri, Baramulla, a site typically used for the burial of militants, an action that sparked outrage and grief among locals. His family expressed anguish over being denied the opportunity to perform his last rites and bury him locally. Officials stated that the decision was based solely on pandemic protocols, not on any assumption about Hazim's identity or involvement.

Exceptional Incident: Amshipora Case: A particularly high-profile incident associated with Gantamulla involves the Amshipora fake encounter of 2020. Three civilians from Rajouri—Imtiyaz Ahmad (25 years old), Abrar Ahmad (20 Years Old), and Mohammad Ibrar (16 years old)—were initially buried at this site after being misidentified as militants. They had travelled to Shopian for work when they were killed in a staged encounter. Subsequent investigation, initiated by the Indian Army and supported by DNA testing, confirmed that the encounter had been staged. The bodies were exhumed after 77 days and returned to their families (see picture 3.31). Public outcry and legal proceedings led to renewed discussions on military accountability and human rights violations in Kashmir. officer responsible, Captain Bhoopendra Singh, was court-martialed dismissed from service. This case underscores a dual reality. While the initial misclassification was a procedural failure, the institutional response—including forensic confirmation, public acknowledgment, and punitive action—demonstrates the state's commitment to accountability when lapses are discovered.

Despite these evidentiary layers, Gantamulla has frequently been misrepresented in public discourse. Several past reports have framed it as a symbol of state-led impunity or as a site of 'mass graves.' documentation and the active involvement of family members, relatives, and local community groups to ensure that burials were done properly, both religiously and ethically. This itself is strong evidence that these graves are not truly 'unmarked'; rather, they are well-documented graves of both local and foreign militants. The real issue only comes up with unidentified foreign militants, whose real identities could not be confirmed. Even then, wherever possible, graves of well-known or popular foreign militants have been properly recorded, such as the grave of *Abu Dujana*, whose case is explained below.

<u>Case study of Abu Dujana</u>: On August 1, 2017, an important counter militancy operation took place in the village of Hakripora in Pulwama District, resulting in the death of Abu Dujana, a top commander of the Lashkar-e-Taiba (LeT) militant group, along with his associate Arif Lalihaari, a local Kashmiri militant. Dujana, a Pakistani national, was one of the most wanted militants operating in Jammu and Kashmir at the time. The incident was

registered under FIR No. 256/17. According to official and local accounts, Abu Dujana had infiltrated into the Kashmir Valley from Pakistan around 2010–2011 and quickly rose through the ranks of Lashkar-e-Taiba to become its chief commander in the region. He was widely known for his operational leadership and media presence, and was involved in several high-profile attacks. Among these were the 2013 Bemina CRPF attack, the 2015 Udhampur attack on a BSF convoy. Following the encounter, Abu Dujana's body was taken to Gantamulla, Sheeri in Baramulla District, which is a designated burial site for foreign militants. His grave could be easily recognized because of his popularity and the wide attention his case received. However, most other foreign militants buried there could not be identified, as they lacked the same level of public recognition or available records. Many of them carried fake identities or no proper identification at all to avoid being traced back to their handlers or networks. In addition, there has often been denial from Pakistan regarding their citizenship, which further complicated the process of officially confirming their identities. Arif Lalihaari, being a local, was buried separately in his native village Lalihaar Kakapora.

Case Study: Junaid Ashraf Khan (Junaid Sehrai): Encounter in Srinagar (District Srinagar) On May 19, 2020, an encounter took place in the Khanmoh locality of Watal Kadal, Srinagar, resulting in the death of Junaid Ashraf Khan, also known as Junaid Sehrai, along with another Hizbul Mujahideen militant. Junaid was the son of Mohammad Ashraf

Sehrai, a senior separatist leader and the chairman of Tehreek-e-Hurriyat. His case is listed as Serial No. 157 under FIR No. 67/2020.

Junaid hailed from Tekipora village in Lolab, Kupwara, but was residing in Barzulla, Srinagar at the time of his active involvement in militancy. He held an MBA from Kashmir University, and his transition from an educated middle-class youth to an armed militant attracted significant public and media attention. In March 2018, Junaid formally joined the Hizbul Mujahideen, a group designated as a terrorist organization by the Government of India, the United States, and the European Union. His decision was particularly symbolic and politically charged, as he became the first son of a senior separatist leader to take up arms—marking a shift that blurred the lines between separatist politics and armed militancy in Kashmir. His father, Mohammad Ashraf Sehrai, had long been associated with the separatist movement in Kashmir. A close confidant of Syed Ali Shah Geelani, Sehrai was educated at Aligarh Muslim University and played a central role in the ideological foundation of Tehreek-e-Hurriyat, which he formally led from 2018 following Geelani's resignation. The father-son dynamic, juxtaposing political separatism with armed resistance, became a powerful narrative within both militant discourse and state counter militancy analyses.

Following the encounter, Junaid's body was not returned to the family—a policy in place at the time for COVID-19 and security-related reasons. Instead, he was buried at the Gantamulla graveyard in Sheeri, Baramulla, a site designated for the burial of militants, particularly those not buried in their native villages due to concerns over public gatherings or unrest. The case of Junaid Sehrai is often cited as a turning point in Kashmir's militancy narrative. It underscored the generational transitions in both separatist politics and armed militancy. More than just an individual case, Junaid's journey represented the convergence of education, ideology, and militancy in a way that challenged conventional understandings of radicalization.

Kabali Mazar (Sheeri, Baramulla)

During the last phase of field investigation into unmarked and unidentified graves across Baramulla, we came across Kabali Graveyard located in Sheeri, Baramulla. This site, shown in Pictures 3.35 and 3.36, contains approximately 60 to 70 graves. Notably, several of these graves are believed to hold the remains of three to four individuals each mostly tribal men resulting in the graveyard's local nickname, *Aunt Magbar*, or 'Camel Hump Graveyard,' due to the characteristic shape of the burial mounds. Locals refer to the site as *Kabali Mazar* (Tribal Graveyard), and assert that it contains the remains of tribal militants commonly referred to as *Kabailis* who were killed during the 1947 invasion of Kashmir. These individuals were part of the armed incursions that marked the beginning of the first Indo-Pak war. Residents recounted how these tribal invaders met their end in Baramulla district amid intense fighting against Kashmiri and Indian Army forces, and were subsequently buried at this location. According to the overwhelming local consensus, these are not unidentified civilian graves from recent decades, but rather the final resting place of tribal invaders from the 1947 conflict.

Conclusion

The comprehensive fieldwork conducted across Baramulla district has offered an unprecedented, evidence-based account of the nature, extent, and composition of unmarked graves in one of Kashmir's most conflict-affected regions. Over the course of our field engagement, 19 graveyards were surveyed, comprising 704 graves. These burial grounds, distributed across Uri, Boniyar, Sheeri, Tangmarg (Gulmarg), and adjoining tehsils, reflect the operational footprint of the three-decade-long conflict, particularly its impact on local communities, administrative institutions, and burial practices. The chapter has revealed a clear and consistent pattern: the overwhelming majority of unidentified and unmarked graves belong to foreign militants, individuals who infiltrated from across the Line of Control (LoC), primarily from Pakistan-occupied Kashmir (PoK) and Afghanistan, and were killed in encounters with Indian security forces. These individuals were buried with due religious rites, usually under the supervision of local Augaf Committees and religious leaders, often with the support of local state institutions. 221 graves were confirmed to belong to foreign militants, classified as unidentified foreign militants, though local testimonies and archival records. In contrast to the genuine lack of identification documentation of foreign militant burials, graves of local militants were largely marked, documented, and acknowledged by the community. 129 such graves were identified during fieldwork, often accompanied by names, familial details, and community memories. This finding directly contradicts the popularized claim that the region is home to 'mass graves' of civilians or victims of enforced disappearance. In Baramulla we also identified and documented around 276 unmarked graves across all documented sites were found to be completely unmarked and untraceable notably in Kitchama and Bimyar, an exceptional rather than systematic phenomenon. We also discovered eight civilian graves who have been buried along with these militants in three different graveyards namely Gauntamulla, Fatehgrah and Bemiyaar. Apart from this, we also identified 70 unidentified graves of tribal invaders at Kabali Mazar.

Chapter 4

District Ganderbal

Introduction

District Ganderbal, carved out as a separate district in 2007, has not been immune to the security challenges and violence that have accompanied the Kashmir conflict since 1989. While earlier investigations by human rights groups focused on North Kashmir unearthing over 2,700 'unmarked graves' in districts like Baramulla, Kupwara, and Bandipora, ⁵⁴ Ganderbal remained largely outside the scope of these initial surveys. To better understand the region's security context, the present report highlights the need to expand documentation beyond the districts studied in earlier investigations. This chapter explores new findings in more detail, including profiles of both identified and unidentified local militants recorded during fieldwork. In this context, the field investigation in Ganderbal aims to provide a clear and factual picture of the situation, based on systematic research and direct engagement with available sources

The chapter particularly highlights the Sonamarg graveyard where the bodies of militants killed during counter militancy operations are buried. The recent shift in burial practices was intended to curb mass funeral gatherings that had previously become sites of public unrest and potential militant recruitment. Importantly, the graves documented during the fieldwork were fully identified, with each grave marked by the name of the deceased and associated details.

Field Engagement

The fieldwork team carried out a focused field visit to a single site in Ganderbal district, located in the Sonamarg area. With the help of local residents, graves without names or clear markers were identified. Interviews were carried out with village elders, gravediggers, and families of deceased individuals to gather background information and oral accounts. Where possible, available records such as First Information Reports (FIRs)

were used to cross-check the details. All findings were documented with photographs and GPS coordinates, and any visible inscriptions were recorded.

Overview of Identified Graves

In the course of fieldwork, a total of 24 graves were identified at the Sonamarg graveyard which is located near Sonamarg Truck Yard (cf. Pictures 4.1 and 4.2 in following pages). Each of these graves were subsequently verified through testimonies from local respondents, as well as from the families of militants who frequently visit the burial sites of their sons for prayers. Out of these 24 graves, 20 were confirmed as belonging to local militants who had been killed in various security operations across different parts of Kashmir and were subsequently buried at the site. Three of the graves were categorized as those of hybrid militants. In the Kashmiri context, the term 'hybrid militant' generally refers to individuals who are not listed in official police records as militants, but are alleged to have been involved in militant activities on a part-time or adhoc basis. Such individuals often maintain an overtly civilian profile, engaging in ordinary occupation or studies, while simultaneously being accused of providing logistical support, shelter or direct participation in militant operations. Their classification is therefore contentious and has been widely debated as it blurs the line between civilians and militant identity. Last one grave was identified as the controversial grave of Irfan Ahmad Dar (listed at serial number 21 of table 4.1).

These individuals had been killed during counter-militancy operations across various districts of Kashmir valley. Following security protocols, they were buried at Sonamarg to prevent large-scale gatherings in their native villages. Among the militants buried here are significant figures like Tariq Ahmed Bhat (alias Luqman Bhai), Riyaz Naikoo and Ishfaq Ahmad Khan, along with several other young men whose deaths sparked varying degrees of public and familial response. Table 4.1 provides a detailed listing of all individuals documented, cross-referenced with FIR numbers and encounter locations. (Full details provided in Table 4.1 that follows).

Case-by-Case Analysis: The following case studies detail the backgrounds, incidents, and burial circumstances of individuals documented during the fieldwork. Each entry references the corresponding Serial Numbers listed in Table 4.1.

Case 1: FIR No. 28/2020 pertains to a significant encounter that occurred on 21 April 2020 at Nikloora, Shopian, resulting in the killing of four militants affiliated with Ansar Ghazwat-ul-Hind (AGH). Among the deceased was Tariq Ahmed Bhat, known by his code name 'Luqman Bhai,' who served as the District Commander for AGH in Shopian. A native of Shopian, Tariq had initially been part of Lashkar-e-Taiba (LeT) before aligning himself with AGH, a shift that reflected the changing organizational loyalties within Kashmir's militancy landscape.

Alongside Tariq, Basharat Ahmed Shah, also known as 'Osama Bhai,' was killed. Hailing from Pulwama, Basharat had similarly transitioned from Lashkar-e-Taiba to AGH. Local accounts describe him as a central figure in the recruitment of young militants and in operational logistics, particularly across the volatile districts of Pulwama and Shopian. His role in expanding AGH's footprint in southern Kashmir marked him as another significant militant operative. The encounter also claimed the life of Vakil Ahmed Dar, who operated under the code name 'Asim Bhai.' A resident of Pulwama, Vakil was a relatively recent recruit to AGH and had become an active part of its operational wing. Although newer to militancy compared to Tariq and Basharat, Vakil was reportedly gaining prominence within AGH's tactical units.

Completing the group was Uzair Amin Bhat, a militant from Baramulla district. Uzair had initially joined the Hizbul Mujahideen before later switching allegiance to AGH, a move not uncommon among militants seeking to align with ideologically different or more active groups. His presence in this group of operatives pointed to the broader interorganizational mobility among militant cadres in Kashmir. Following the encounter, the bodies of all four militants were processed through medico-legal formalities and later transported to Sonamarg in Ganderbal district for burial, in accordance with the security protocols designed to minimize public gatherings that could potentially escalate into unrest. Their graves remain marked and documented as part of the field research detailed in this chapter.

Case 2: FIR No. 154/2020 relates to the encounter that took place on 25 July 2020 at Ranbirgarh-Panzinara in Srinagar, resulting in the killing of two militants. The first was Ishfaq Ahmad Khan, son of Abdul Rashid Khan, a resident of Sozeith, Srinagar. Ishfaq was a commander associated with Lashkar-e-Taiba (LeT) and had been active in militant ranks since 2018. He was reportedly involved in multiple militancy-related cases across the region and was considered a significant figure within the LeT's operational structure. The second militant was Ajaz Ahmed Bhat, a resident of Pulwama district, who was also affiliated with Lashkar-e-Taiba. After the encounter, medico-legal formalities were completed, and the bodies of both individuals were transported to Ganderbal for burial. Their graves are located at the designated burial site in Ganderbal, in line with prevailing security protocols aimed at limiting public funerary gatherings.

Case 3: Irfan Ahmad Dar, a 23-year-old shopkeeper from Sidiq Colony, Bomai Sopore, was arrested on 15 September 2020 by the Special Operation Group (SOG) of the Jammu and Kashmir Police. The authorities alleged that Dar was found in possession of two Chinese hand grenades and subsequently classified him as an over-ground worker (OGW) assisting militant groups. Following his arrest, an FIR (No. 257/2020) was registered against him under Section 18 of the Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act. According to the police version, during a search operation in the Chairdaji area of Tujjar-Sharief the following day, Dar attempted to escape custody and was later found dead near a stone quarry. Consequently, an additional FIR (No. 71/2020) was filed under Section 224 of the Indian Penal Code, relating to thealleged escape. However, Dar's family forcefully refuted

the official claims, maintaining that Irfan had no links to any militant organization and that he was a law-abiding shopkeeper with no previous record of unlawful activities. Due to COVID-19 protocols in place at the time, Irfan Ahmad Dar's body was not returned to his family but was instead buried by the police at the Sonamarg graveyard in Ganderbal.

Case 4: The Lawaypora encounter of 30 December 2020 stands as one of the most hotly debated incidents in recent conflict documentation from Kashmir. According to police records and local testimonies gathered during field visits, a cordon-and-search operation was carried out at a building located along the Srinagar-Baramulla highway near Lawaypora in Srinagar. By the end of the operation, three young men namely Zubair Ahmed Lone, Ather Mushtaq Wani, and Aijaz Ahmed Ganaie had been killed. FIR No. 273/2020 was registered in connection with the case.

Zubair Ahmed Lone, the son of Ghulam Mohammad Lone from Turkwangam, Shopian; Ather Mushtaq Wani, the son of Mushtaq Ahmed Wani from Bellow Dargund, Pulwama; and Aijaz Ahmed Ganaie, the son of Mohammad Maqbool Ganaie from Putrigam, Pulwama, were officially classified as overground workers (OGWs) linked to militant activities. According to the police, the three were allegedly providing logistical support to militants and were planning a possible attack. It was claimed that arms and ammunition were recovered from the site of the encounter. However, significantly, no prior militant records for any of the three were found in police databases.

Family version: The families of the deceased offered a forceful and emotional rebuttal to the claims made by the authorities. Following medico-legal formalities, the bodies of all three individuals were transported and buried at the Sonamarg graveyard in Ganderbal district. This decision, made under prevailing security protocols, deprived the families of the chance to perform final funeral rites in their native villages.

Conclusion

The documentation of 'identified graves' at the Sonamarg graveyard in Ganderbal district marks a significant development in the evolving approach toward conflict management and security practices in Kashmir. Unlike earlier concerns in other districts where anonymous raised serious human rights issues, the graves documented during this fieldwork were fully identified, complete with names, places of residence, and official case records. This shift toward transparency reflects a deliberate policy aimed at balancing counter militancy challenges with humanitarian obligations. The relocation of militant burials from native villages to remote graveyards like Sonamarg served as a tactical measure to prevent mass funeral gatherings, which in the past had become fertile grounds for further radicalization and public unrest. By disrupting the cycle of mass mobilization and militant glorification traditionally associated with militant funerals, authorities have sought to address security challenges while still permitting religious rites to be performed, often with family presence under controlled conditions. However, several cases studied in this chapter reveal the complex human dimensions and contestations that persist around encounter deaths. The deaths of individuals like Irfan Ahmad Dar, alleged to be an overground worker, and the three young men killed in the Lawaypora encounter, have raised serious questions. Particularly notable is the emergence of a new category of individuals termed 'hybrid militants' or suspected 'overground workers' (OGWs), individuals who may be engaged in militancy-related activities at a covert or intermittent level, most times without the full knowledge of their families. As highlighted by the Lawaypora case, families frequently assert complete ignorance about their sons' alleged involvement, insisting on their civilian status until confronted by their deaths.

Chapter 5

Bandipora

Introduction

Bandipora district, nestled along the northern banks of the Wullar Lake, the largest freshwater lake in South Asia, holds a crucial yet always understated position in the conflict geography of Jammu and Kashmir. Historically part of the erstwhile Baramulla district, Bandipora emerged as a separate administrative unit in 2007. Flanked by the rugged mountains of Gurez to the north and bounded by strategic corridors like the Gurez-Bandipora axis, the district occupies a critical position in understanding cross-border infiltration, counter militancy dynamics, and the resultant patterns of violence and burial practices. Unlike Baramulla, which was an early epicenter of militant activity and counter militancy operations in the 1990s, Bandipora remained relatively peripheral until the mid-1990s when its proximity to Pakistan-Occupied Kashmir (PoK) transformed it into a vital route for militant infiltration. Particularly through the Gurez sector, heavily forested terrains, and remote high-altitude passes, militants infiltrated into the Kashmir Valley, leading to intensified military engagements. This militarization of the landscape inevitably influenced local social practices, including the management of the dead. Burial practices, notably the emergence of 'unmarked' or 'minimally marked' graves, became embedded within the counter militancy apparatus, balancing operational expediency, religious obligations, and security imperatives.

Field research conducted across 116 graveyards in Bandipora revealed a layered story of 339 local militants and 600 foreign militants buried across the district. Significantly, a large proportion of foreign militants buried in Bandipora were killed during heightened infiltration periods in the 1990s, with available indicators such as recovered identification materials, official records and oral testimonies suggesting Pakistani origins. The graveyards in Bandipora predominantly contain individuals who died in identifiable counter-insurgency operations whether in ambushes, infiltration encounters, or counter militancy sweeps. The role of advocacy groups in drawing attention to unmarked graves in Kashmir cannot be understated. Previous reports have highlighted the need for transparent investigations, forensic inquiries, and accountability mechanisms. Yet, as seen in Bandipora, the challenge lies in parsing the complex realities of conflict: distinguishing between militants, foreign militants, and potentially misidentified civilians, often without

the benefit of complete documentation. In this chapter, we aim to systematically document the burial practices associated with conflict-related deaths in Bandipora, map the graveyards geographically, and analyze the classification of graves.

Field Engagement

The methodology adopted for the study of unmarked graves in Bandipora district was anchored in the principles of fieldwork and careful cross-verification, consistent with the approach followed in the earlier districts. The team covered a total of 116 graveyards spread across both accessible villages and remote frontier areas. Access to graveyards and local populations was facilitated through a network of trusted intermediaries, including Auqaf committee members, mosque caretakers, village elders, and local residents' familiar with the burial histories of their communities. In a context where memories of violence coexist with ongoing security apprehensions, establishing trust was a prerequisite for meaningful inquiry. Engaging with these intermediaries allowed the team to mitigate suspicion, navigate socio-political sensitivities, and ensure the dignity of both the sites and the respondents.

The research employed a combination of semi-structured interviews, observational surveys, photographic documentation, and archival cross-referencing. Interviews were conducted with gravediggers, religious leaders, elderly residents, and family members of deceased militants wherever possible. These conversations offered valuable oral histories, revealing not just names and affiliations but also personal narratives surrounding the deaths, burials, and evolving community perceptions over time. Each gravesite was carefully photographed and geotagged to create a verifiable spatial record, while particular attention was paid to documenting grave markers, inscriptions, and spatial arrangements within cemeteries. A central aspect of the methodology involved the cross-verification of oral testimonies with available secondary sources. Wherever possible, First Information Reports (FIRs), police station records, local press archives, and encounter documentation were consulted to corroborate field findings. Particular emphasis was placed on identifying graves that had previously been the subject of local speculation regarding missing persons. This triangulation of sources, in context of Bandipora district, allowed us to classify graves into four primary categories: identified local militants, unidentified

foreign militants (often designate FTs or foreign terrorists by security agencies), unmarked and civilians.

The process of documentation extended beyond mere data collection. In many instances, respondents offered fragmented recollections, reflecting both the passage of time and the erosion of formal records during the peak conflict years of the 1990s. Graves from this period, particularly those associated with cross-border infiltration via Gurez, were often accompanied by minimal or no documentation, heightening the challenge of verification. The methodology acknowledged inherent limitations, including restricted access to certain high-security zones and the occasional absence of official encounter reports, particularly for deaths occurring in the early phases of militancy. Nevertheless, by triangulating field observations, oral histories, and archival materials, the study was able to construct a credible and nuanced portrait of burial practices in Bandipora's conflict landscape. The following sections build upon this methodological foundation, presenting detailed quantitative and qualitative findings that reflect both the operational exigencies and the human stories intertwined with the graves of Bandipora.

Overview of Graves in Bandipora

The field investigation in Bandipora district identified a total of 939 graves associated with individuals who lost their lives in the context of armed militancy and counter militancy operations. Of these, 339 graves were found to belong to local militants originating from within Jammu and Kashmir, while 600 graves were attributed to foreign militants, predominantly believed to be of Pakistani nationality. In the earlier phases of the conflict, it was common practice for the bodies of both local and foreign militants to be handed over to families or, in many cases, retrieved by community members themselves, who ensured that burials took place in ancestral graveyards or designated sites. This practice reflected the widespread reverence for militants during that period, as deceased militants were always regarded as 'martyrs', and burying them with dignity in familiar settings was considered a profound religious duty.

Analysis of affiliation patterns indicated that the majority of the militants buried in Bandipora were associated with groups such as Hizbul Mujahideen (HM) and Lashkar-e-Toiba (LeT), two organizations that played a central role in shaping the militancy landscape of Kashmir throughout the 1990s and early 2000s. The prominence of Hizbul Mujahideen graves is consistent with the historical profile of militancy in North Kashmir, where local recruitment surged in the initial years of the conflict. In contrast, the presence of a significant number of foreign militants, particularly those buried along infiltrationprone areas such as the Gurez sector, reflects the evolution of the conflict's transnational dimensions as infiltration from Pakistan-Occupied Kashmir (POK) intensified. The findings further underscored a stark distinction between the identification processes of local and foreign militants. In most cases involving local militants, identification was facilitated by surviving family members, village communities, or available administrative records. Funeral ceremonies were often organized with the participation of relatives and community elders. Conversely, foreign militants while buried anonymously due to nonavailability of their claimants (families) were given formal burial. Infiltrators killed during gun battles or ambushes often carried little to no formal documentation, and even when identification markers such as national insignias or Pakistani-manufactured goods were found, formal processes of identification were rarely pursued. As a result, the responsibility of burial frequently fell upon local mosque committees, gravediggers, or village Augaf bodies, who ensured that basic religious rites were performed despite the anonymity of the deceased. The operational challenges posed by the conflict, particularly during periods of heightened militancy in the 1990s, contributed significantly to the emergence of these patterns. Rapid burial without exhaustive documentation was often seen as necessary to maintain public order, and adhere to religious imperatives regarding the timely burial of the dead. Nevertheless, the overall effect of these practices has been the creation of a landscape where the memory of the deceased is unevenly preserved, celebrated in some cases, forgotten or anonymized in others.

The following sections delve deeper into the geographic distribution of these graves, the classification patterns observed in the field, and the complex narratives surrounding identified or unidentified graves across Bandipora. Tables 5.1 (Annexed) offer detailed listings of graveyards and corresponding burial numbers, reinforcing the geographic dispersion, operational patterns, and conflict history that have shaped Bandipora's complex landscape of remembrance. It is worth mentioning that in Bandipora district, mostly the graves of local militants have been identified who were killed in gun battles with security forces mostly during the 1990s when terrorism was at its peak in Kashmir.

The majority of Foreign Militants who are buried in the aforementioned graveyards of Bandipora district were killed during the 1990s period when infiltration from Pakistan was happening routinely particularly in the Gurez sector.

Field Evidence

Table 5.1 provides comprehensive list of identified /Unidentified dead bodies of militants buried in the aforementioned graveyards of Bandipora district with effect from 1990 to November, 2022. It includes all the evidence such as name and residence, place of gun battle, affiliation and most importantly, FIR, and date and place of burial.

Conclusion

The above field documentation and analysis of graves across Bandipora district offers a decisive correction to previous speculative accounts that framed these sites within the narrative of mass and unmarked burials. Through long term field engagement crossreferencing of encounter reports, and the testimony of local communities and families, it becomes evident that an overwhelming majority of the graves belong to militants both local and foreign who were actively engaged in armed violence. Many of them were affiliated with internationally banned terrorist organizations and were killed during direct confrontations with security forces, often in well-documented operations. This reality challenges the earlier assumptions that had been largely based on limited field engagement and selective testimonies. The findings reaffirm that security forces adhered to established protocols of recording identities, facilitating dignified burials, and maintaining operational transparency even under extreme conflict conditions. The presence of foreign militants, particularly those infiltrating from across the border, highlights the external dimensions of the violence that gripped the region during the 1990s and early 2000s, an aspect frequently minimized in prior reporting. Rather than reflecting a systematic disregard for human rights, the burial sites in Bandipora embody the consequences of a militancy fueled both from within and beyond the border. They stand as evidence of a difficult but necessary security response to sustained armed aggression. Acknowledging the true character of these graves allows for a more honest reckoning with the past, one that recognizes the complexities of conflict without succumbing to politically motivated distortions. In doing so, the present chapter, along with the broader study, underscores the importance of rigorous empirical inquiry over preconceived narratives, offering a grounded and more accurate understanding of the realities in conflict-affected regions like Bandipora.

Chapter 6

District Kupwara

Introduction

The chapter presents a comprehensive and evidence-based investigation into the burial practices associated with unmarked and marked graves in the Kupwara district of North Kashmir, one of the most geopolitically sensitive regions of the Valley. Kupwara, established as an administrative district in 1979, spans an area of 2,379 square kilometers and comprises 363 villages. 55 It shares over 170 kilometers of boundary with the Line of Control (LoC), making it a critical frontier zone between India and Pakistan. The district's topography, flanked by the Pir Panjal and Shams Bari Mountain ranges, renders it not only strategically significant from a military standpoint but also highly vulnerable to infiltration by cross-border militants. Historically, this terrain has served as a crucial route for foreign militants and militants, particularly during the rise of militancy in the early 1990s. Kupwara is further characterized by its challenging geography and harsh climatic conditions. The district is bound by approximately 170 kilometers of the Line of Actual Control (LoC) in the north, while its southern boundary connects to Baramulla district. Three major border pockets namely Machil, Keran, and Karnah lie close to the LoC and remain physically cut off from the Valley floor for over four months each year due to heavy snowfall at high-altitude passes. In addition to these, several remote settlements as Kumkadi, Lashdat, Jumgund, Kethanwal, and Budnambal also such experience prolonged isolation from the district headquarters, making both governance and access particularly difficult in these zones.⁵⁶ These factors have compounded the district's vulnerability and its prominence in the conflict landscape of Jammu and Kashmir. In light of this context, the present chapter undertakes the systematic and structured survey of graveyards across Kupwara. The research involved both physical inspections of grave sites and extensive interviews with local stakeholders, including residents, gravediggers, clerics, and law enforcement officials. This dual-layered methodology, combining qualitative oral histories with verifiable documentary records, sought to document and

verify the existence, identity, and categorization of graves in the region, aiming to bring clarity to a subject often obscured by speculation and competing narratives.

The fieldwork was carried out in various phases. Altogether, the investigation documented a total 237 graveyards. Around 2,389 graves were documented from these graveyards out of which 717 were confirmed to be of local militants and 1672 belonged to non-local or foreign militants. These figures reflect the sustained pattern of infiltration and armed engagement in the region and underscore the operational complexity that has shaped burial practices in conflict environment. Crucially, the findings presented in the chapter challenge some of the dominant external narratives that portray Kupwara as a site of mass civilian graves. Instead, the chapter presents a grounded, evidence-backed account showing that the majority of graves belong to combatants, many of them foreign, killed during security operations. In doing so, the chapter contributes meaningfully to the broader report's goal of depolarizing the discourse around unmarked graves by focusing on transparency, factual accuracy, and methodological rigor.

Field Engagement

The Kupwara chapter follows the same multi-pronged methodological framework employed throughout the wider research project. This involved systematic fieldwork including physical site surveys, geotagging, and photographic documentation of graves, combined with in-depth community-level interviews with clerics, gravediggers, residents, and local law enforcement personnel. These multiple streams of data collection were essential for ensuring both empirical depth and verification of the burial records in a highly sensitive and operationally complex district. Fieldwork was carried out in various phases: the first focusing on graveyards used for burials in recent times, and the second focused on previously unexplored sites containing graves dating back to the height of militancy in the 1990s. Through this approach, the research team was able to document not just recent patterns of burial but also trace the historical layers of conflict-related deaths in the district. Crucially, a majority of the graves documented, especially those of local militants, dated back to the 1990s, a period marked by intense cross-border infiltration and armed engagements. The identities of these local militants were largely cross-verified through community testimonies and corroborated by surviving family members. However, such verification or documentation was not possible in the case of foreign militants, who typically carried no identification and had no familial presence in the region. a classification often made based on recovered identification documents, local popularity, physical features, or belongings found with the deceased.

Graveyard at Kayan Kishtwar Nowgam

Our team visited a site in the Kupwara district, namely Kayan Kishtwar Nowgam. After visiting the site, we found 61 graves. In our findings, we came to know that it is mostly the local Kashmiri militants who are buried in these graves who were killed in various gun battles with the security forces. Few graves also contained dead bodies of slain foreign militants. For instance, the total number of graves at the Kayan Kishtwar Nowgam graveyard is 61, out of which 6 graves are of foreign militants, and 55 are of local militants. The graves of all the local militants are marked showing their identities (cf. Pictures 6.1, 6.2, 6.3, 6.4, 6.5, 6.6, 6.7 and 6.8). Their detailed records have been mentioned in Table 6.1. The families of local are allowed to visit their graves.

Graveyard at Wadder Payeen

As part of our survey in the Kupwara district, we identified a graveyard site located in Wadder Payeen. This site contains a total of 115 graves (refer to table 6.2). As per documented evidences, we identified 115 graves, 96 are recorded as belonging to individuals classified as local militants, 19 are attributed to foreign militants. A detailed record of these burials is presented in Table 6.2.

Burial Records of Militants in Kupwara (1990s-Present) (Second Phase)

Since Kupwara is a border district and shares a large part of its boundary with Pakistan Occupied Kashmir (POK), it has seen occurrence of highest number of gun battles and terrorist casualties because of frequent infiltration attempts, cross border attacks, and even exfiltration attempts. Pakistani military establishment has often used frontier districts in POK as terrorist training centres and infiltration launch pads to propel terrorism in Kashmir valley. Because of its proximity to the Line of Control (LOC), the de facto border which divides POK from Kashmir valley, Kupwara district has borne the brunt of Pakistan sponsored terrorism. Due to Pakistan's consistent denial, these militants, who were killed in various gun battles, infiltration attempts and cross-LOC attacks, have been buried in various villages across Kupwara. The below section provides a detailed record of these burial sites and related information (see Table 6.3), including available official version, local narratives, organisational affiliations, and the locations where the encounters took place.

During the peak of the conflict, particularly in the 1990s and early 2000s, militants from across the Pakistan border often infiltrated in groups of 10 to 20 individuals. This is evidenced by the record at serial number 380, where nine foreign militants are listed under the same FIR and at the same location. This supports the fact that foreign militants were frequently involved in episodes that resulted in a high number of casualties, as seen in this case.

the peak of militancy in Kashmir, many local youths who attempted to cross the Line of Control (LOC) for militant training were either killed in groups at the border or, if successful in initially crossing into Pakistan occupied Kashmir (POK), were killed upon their return while attempting to re-cross the LOC. A significant number of such incidents were reported in areas like Kupwara and other LOC sectors. Due to the lack of communication systems at the time, it was extremely difficult to ascertain the identities of those killed or to contact their families. Typically, it was only after local police stations circulated photographs and any available identification details across different districts that families could be reached. Once identified, families were allowed to exhume the deceased and rebury them in their native villages. Investigative teams also discovered several empty graves, which were found to be sites where bodies had been exhumed by family's post-identification. Such episodes were more common when the militants belonged to districts other than where they were buried

Conclusion

The above findings from Kupwara offer a clear and fact-based answer to common claims about unmarked graves in Kashmir. These graves do not support the idea of widespread civilian killings or secret mass graves. Instead, they reflect the long and difficult history of conflict in the region, especially Kupwara's role as a frontline area during years of intense militant activity and cross-border infiltration from Pakistan. Most of the graves belong to militants, many of them foreign militants, who were killed during encounters with security forces. These foreign militants often carried no identification and had no family or contacts in the region. Because of this, it was usually not possible to confirm who they

were. As a result, they were buried without names or proper records. This was not part of any hidden plan, but a response to the realities of active conflict. However, not all nonlocal militants were impossible to identify. Two important examples show this like Mohd Yasin and Thaikandi Mohd Faiz, both from Kerala, were members of Hizbul Mujahideen and were killed in Kupwara in 2008. Because their citizenship was known although they belonged outside Kashmir, their identities were confirmed and recorded in police files (ref serial Nos. 1023 and 1024 in Table 6.3), and their graves were marked and verifiable. This shows that when militants were killed in Kashmir even if they belonged from mainland India, their identity could often be confirmed. Until 2020, it was common practice to return the bodies of local militants to their families, and even foreign militants were buried near the encounter sites. But this changed in 2020, and since then, all militants killed in encounters have been buried in remote areas, far from their homes. But in 1990s and 2000 period, when militants came from across the border, like Pakistan, it was much harder, if not impossible, to verify who they were. It's also important to understand how things worked during the 1990s. Back then, communication was poor. Even in the case of local militants, it was sometimes hard to know who had died. When police found a body after an encounter, they would send out basic details of the dead militant, like name, appearance, and group affiliation, to police stations across Kashmir. If a police station recognized the person as someone from their area, they would contact the family. Sometimes, families came to claim the body. In other cases, they came weeks later and even exhumed the body to bury it in their ancestral graveyard. This process took time, and not every identity could be confirmed right away. The report did not find any strong evidence suggesting that the graves documented at these sites belonged to civilians. The case of Kupwara highlights the importance of relying on verified information from field visits and local accounts to build a clearer understanding of the situation.

Chapter 7

Conclusion

The issue of unmarked and unidentified graves in Kashmir has been surrounded by confusion, emotions, and many serious allegations for years. Several reports and advocacy groups have claimed and highlighted that these graves 'might' contain the bodies of innocent civilians who were either forcibly disappeared or killed in fake encounters. This narrative perpetrated and promoted by multiple actors both within and outside Kashmir has taken hold in public perception, where unidentified graves were often presented as symbols of the Indian state's alleged human rights violations. Such narrative not only influenced public perception/imagination as the purported symbol of Indian state's excessive human rights violations within Kashmir but also shaped how the international community views the conflict. This narrative has long fueled secessionist sentiment in Kashmir and continues to sustain the conflict today; it has been actively capitalized on by secessionist elements and others to generate animosity among ordinary Kashmiris, many of whom were previously unaware of the deeper dynamics of the conflict. As the report shows, some unmarked graves are found in Baramulla, but not in all the districts that were studied. The presence of these graveyards does not mean that all graves are unmarked or without records. While we do not rule out the possibility that some civilians may have died in crossfire or other incidents, most of the graves documented here either belong to unidentified foreign militants or local militants. The state for which such militants are fighting for in Kashmir are disowned by them after being neutralized by the Indian security forces. The increase of graveyards resulting due to militancy related deaths in Kashmir is overflown with such disowned militants of Pakistani origin. As has been described earlier, the main aim of these militant groups operating in Kashmir, their sympathizers in the frontal organisations and the fifth Columnists in academia, civil society, and journalism, at the behest of Pakistani deep state, is to constantly blame Indian security forces and to create a narrative that security forces kill 'innocent people' to create dissatisfaction and unrest by inciting the local populace especially youth towards militancy. All the atrocities of militant groups are covered up using such propaganda. It is in this propagandist vein that the bogey of unmarked and unknown graves has been created in Kashmir.

So, what's the real story behind these claims? To find out, we didn't rely on guesses or blame anyone. Instead, we went to the ground and did our own research. In the present report, we covered four districts in Kashmir, Baramulla, Kupwara, Bandipora, and Ganderbal visiting 373 graveyards and recording details of 4,056 graves. We didn't do this to protect any group or push any side. Our only aim was to understand the truth, using real evidence, voices of local people, and facts we or any other common person can verify. What we found through this report is quite different from what some earlier reports have said. Most of the graves we looked at were of militants, some local, some from across the border who were killed in encounters with Indian security forces. Except some 'unmarked' graveyards of unknown persons, majority of these graves belong to people who died in specific incidents like gunfights, infiltration attempts, or attacks. Many of these militants, especially the foreign ones, were never claimed by any family or group. Most of them were killed while crossing over from Pakistan-occupied Kashmir (POK) or during counter-insurgency operations. As highlighted in earlier chapters, many of these unidentified militants were actually sent from across the border. But Pakistan government and their handlers often disown them to keep up the false image that militancy in Kashmir is purely local and that Pakistan has no role in it. The truth, however, is well known to people in Kashmir. Even local Kashmiris know that many of these unidentified militants were actually Pakistanis, sent and supported from across the border. This is further shown by the mention of several well-known Pakistani names in earlier chapters, pointing to the cross-border nature of militancy and the support behind it. Even when their bodies are found, no one comes forward to claim them because admitting the truth would expose Pakistan's direct involvement. By playing this denial game, Pakistan tries to stay out of the international spotlight and avoid being held responsible for fueling violence in the region. Thus, conflict in J&K has taken a heavy toll not just on militants (local or foreign) but also on Indian security forces and ordinary people. Indian security forces have also faced major losses in conflict. According to a 2020 report by the Indian government, since the insurgency began in the early 1990s, around 14,091 civilians, and 5,356 security personnel have died in Kashmir. These numbers show how devastating the conflict has been for everyone involved: militants, soldiers, and common people.

This report has tried to bring clarity to an issue that has caused confusion and debate both within India and internationally. The Indian state has often been accused of human rights

violations while responding to the rise in militant violence in Kashmir. By carefully documenting the identities and origins of those buried in these graves, this report has aimed to present facts based on ground-level data, helping people better understand the real picture behind a deeply sensitive and often misunderstood issue.

After carefully analyzing the data in table 7.1, one can speak on factual basis that the earlier claims about widespread mass graves of civilians are not supported by the ground reality. We checked each graveyard ourselves, spoke with local people, cross-verified official records, and cross-referenced all information. The story that emerged was clear that the overwhelming majority of graves belong to militants, not civilians. Yes, there are some unmarked graves especially in Baramulla (around 276) and we believe they should be examined more closely. It is also important to understand that missing documentation during war-like conditions does not always mean wrongdoing. In any conflict zone, confusion and poor recordkeeping are common. We are not saying that civilians were never harmed. In fact, we openly acknowledge that some civilians 'may' have been wrongly killed or may have gone missing during this conflict. There is a possibility though limited that a few of the unmarked graves may belong to civilians caught in crossfire, fake encounters, or other tragic situations. Such cases must not be ignored. That is why we strongly urge the authorities to conduct a full and transparent investigation into all unmarked graves. In particular, we request detailed examinations of the 276 unmarked graves in Baramulla. Modern forensic tools like DNA testing should be used, and local

families who have missing members should be involved for identification process. Justice must not be denied to anyone, and truth must be disclosed however difficult it may be. We also want to make it clear that this report is not the final word. It covers only four districts. Many parts of Kashmir still remain undocumented. Many graveyards are yet to be visited. We faced challenges in terms of access, resources and security. So, this is not a complete report it is only the first step in this direction. In the next phase of our research, we plan to expand our work to other districts. We aim to study more graves, collect more community stories, and cross-verify more official records. Our goal is simple that no grave should remain without a name, and no family should be left without answers. That said, we do not suggest that the conflict has been without pain or mistakes. The report, drawn from diverse sources of evidence, critically examined prior claims regarding the presence of large numbers of unidentified mass graves of civilians.

Our findings indicate that many of previous allegations are based on incomplete, misinterpreted, or unverified evidence. While some concerns over human rights and conflict-related casualties are valid and warrant careful consideration, the available data does not support the assertion that these graves primarily contain civilians. Instead, the report suggests that the majority of individuals buried in the marked graves were militants who lost their lives in encounters with security forces. It is important to acknowledge that in any prolonged conflict like in J&K, the conduct of all parties involved, including state authorities, should be subject to scrutiny. At the same time, attributing all instances of violence or unmarked graves to state actions alone would be an oversimplification. The burial of militants in designated sites followed established procedures, and available records provide clarity on their identities. Civilian casualties, where they have occurred, are deeply regrettable and require continued investigation and accountability. However, conflating such cases with broader claims of mass civilian graves risks distorting the complex realities on the ground. A factual and evidence-based approach to understanding these graves is essential for fostering informed dialogue, addressing legitimate concerns, and promoting a path towards reconciliation in Kashmir. By depending on verifiable information rather than unsubstantiated claims, it becomes possible to engage in a more constructive discussion about the region's past and future. To conclude, the report tried to separate myth from fact. It does not deny the pain of the past, but it brings real evidence to

light. It invites readers to look at the issue with fresh eyes through the lens of reality, not rumor. The conflict in Kashmir has been long, bloody, and full of sorrow. There have been losses on all sides. We hope this report helps start a more honest and informed conversation about the reality on the ground. To move toward peace and healing, we must begin with truth. We have tried to let the data speak for itself and let the voices from the ground be heard.

In the end, we believe that every person regardless of who they were deserves dignity and respect, both in life and in death. While many of the individuals buried in these unmarked graves were sent from across the border, Pakistan has consistently failed to acknowledge or claim them after they were killed. What this report suggests is that Pakistan, at the very least, should recognize these individuals as its citizens or allow their families to visit their graves, in line with international human rights norms and humanitarian considerations. Let us move forward with truth, compassion, and a firm commitment to uncovering the full story guided not by assumptions, but by careful documentation and human dignity. Each grave holds a story that deserves to be known, remembered, and understood.
